Sirach 15:15-20; 1 Corinthians 2:6-10;  
Matthew 5:17-37 or 5: 20-22a, 27-28, 33-34a, 37

We don't like to hear it, but we are responsible for our actions! The first reading tells us that we can choose to do good, or we can choose to do evil. We are in charge. And we must take the responsibility for our deeds.

We can choose life, or we can choose death. God does not command anyone to sin; in fact, he makes sure that no one is ever tempted beyond the strength to resist. So what excuses do we have for our behavior?

Our Christian moral code goes beyond our natural inclinations; it even goes beyond the commands of the Old Law. The former law commanded us not to murder; Jesus says we are not even to be angry.

The old law said that we must not commit adultery; Jesus says we must not have lust in our heart. The old law commanded us to fulfill our vows; Jesus says that if we are truly loyal to him, oaths are unnecessary. He commands us to say what we mean, and always to act according to our good conscience.

Our second reading speaks of "wisdom." Pagans thought that "wisdom" was speculation and argumentation. Paul says that real wisdom is to know the mystery of God: that he loved us so much that he sent his Son to save us, and that his Son died and rose that we might have life.

Let us always have the wisdom to seek to know God's will at all times, and the courage to do his will. Remember, we are responsible for our souls.

### Dear Parishioners,

This Wednesday, February 18 is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the season of Lent. According to the ordo which guides our participation in the sacramental life of the Church, "the annual observance of Lent is the special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Through its twofold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent disposes both the catechumens (non-baptized) and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery. Catechumens are led to the sacraments of initiation by means of the rite of election, the scrutinies, and catechesis. The faithful, listening more intently to the word of God and devoting themselves to prayer, are prepared through a spirit of repentance to renew their baptismal promises. Lent runs from Ash Wednesday until the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive on Holy Thursday.

Lent is the principal penitential season of the Church year. All the Christian faithful are urged to develop and maintain a voluntary program of self-denial, serious prayer, and performing of deeds of charity and mercy, including the giving of alms. The Lenten regulations are posted in another part of our bulletin for this week. Even though there are age restrictions to fasting and abstinence, I ask our parents to consider celebrating this season as a family, fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and abstaining from meat also on those days and the Fridays of Lent. I can't imagine cooking a separate meal for the kids—it seems to go against what Lent is all about. Two days of Lent and every Friday might teach our young people the value of fasting and abstinence. But for the elderly who will make this sacrifice, I ask you to keep yourselves healthy, perhaps eating more when needed or not fasting at all. I want you to keep yourselves healthy and if this means disregarding some of the Lenten regulations, then please do so for your personal health.

As I previously stated, this Wednesday, February 18 is Ash Wednesday. To usher in this new season of Lent our Mass schedule at St. Peter Church will be as follows:

**Masses at 8:20 p.m., (10:00 at QND), 12:10 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.**

During the season of Lent, we will be celebrating a second Mass each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. and then the devotions, the station of the cross and Benediction each Friday at 6:30 p.m.. We will be hearing Confessions on both Wednesday and Fridays beginning at 5:30 p.m. and continuing to 6:15 p.m. The confessional time is very important to our families who have a second grader making his/her first confession.

A parishioner recently asked me how to hold her hands when praying. I thought that was an interesting question. What prompted her to ask is that she sees many differing people holding their hands during the prayers of the people. Some have folded hands, others have hands in the orans position as the priest, others might be holding the hands of an infant or spouse. As I thought about her question, I think it says much about a parish who prays. We may not do everything the same way, but we are praying together. I am very thankful for that. Personally, it doesn't worry me that we all pray differently—at least we are praying.

# Parish in Action

## LENTEN REGULATIONS

ABSTINENCE - Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

1. FAST - Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
2. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.
3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.


