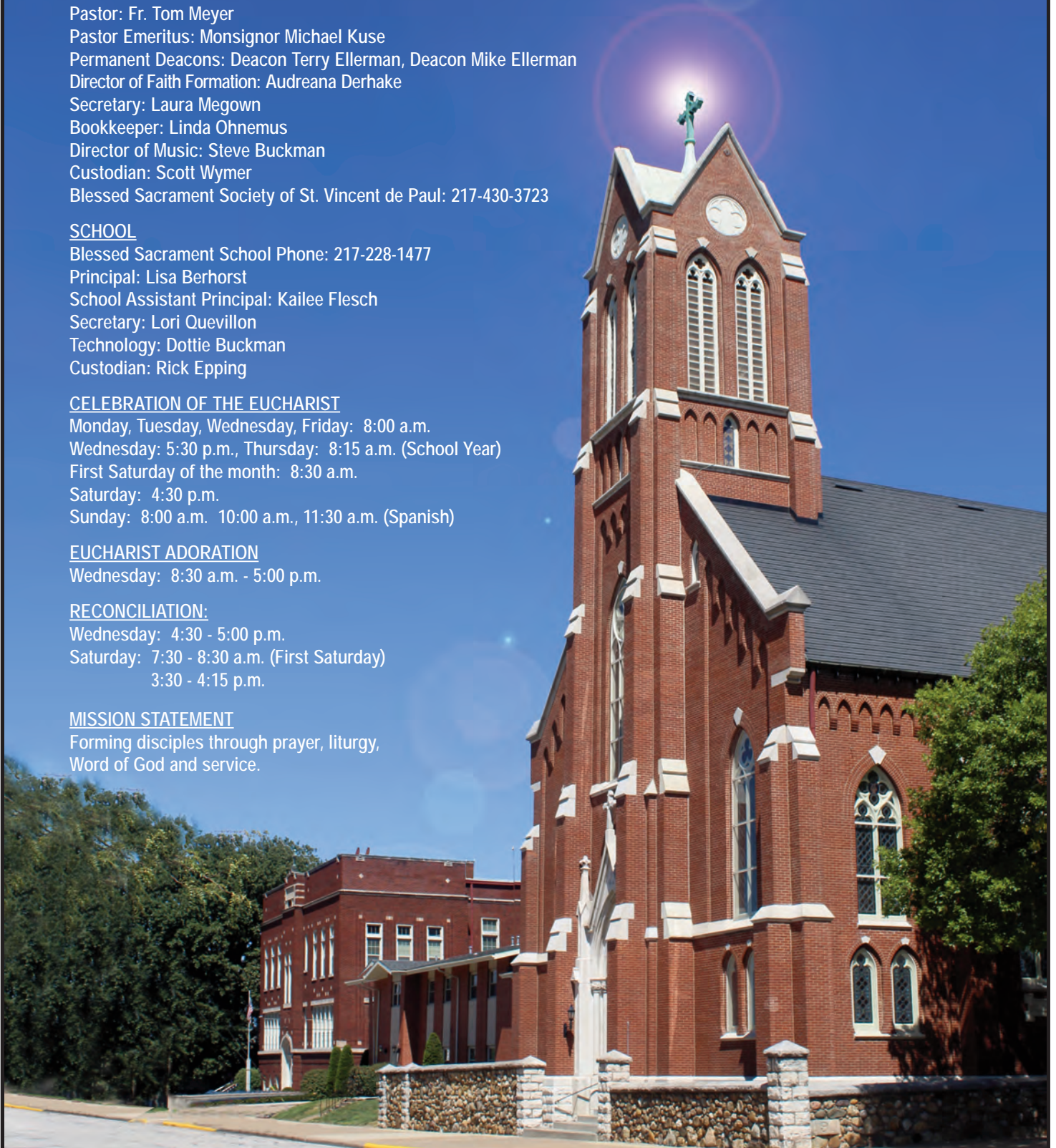

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **1st Sunday of Lent**. In the gospel we hear of Jesus' forty days in the desert being tempted by Satan. Our own forty days of Lent can also be an opportunity for us to be led into the desert where we can focus more deliberately on our relationship with God. May these forty days be for us an opportunity for spiritual renewal.

The season of **Lent** should include the following elements for us to focus upon: (1) Fasting -giving up something we like; (2) Prayer; and (3) Charity – doing charitable works for others and donating money to charity. Blessed Sacrament will provide several liturgical and devotional opportunities each week during Lent to assist you in your spiritual growth during this Lenten season.

I hope it might be a nice way to prepare for the Passion Reading that we will hear this upcoming Palm Sunday. Our Friday evening Lenten schedule looks like this:

5:40-6:10 p.m. Lenten Meditation on Passion according to St. Matthew
6:15-6:45 p.m. Stations of the Cross

This upcoming Tuesday, February 24 at 5:30 p.m. we celebrate **1st Reconciliation for all of our 2nd Grade students**. Please pray for our 2nd Grade students that they might have a wonderful first encounter with the power of God's mercy in their lives.

Please mark your calendars for our **Parish Dinner scheduled for Saturday, March 14** at Quincy University. This event is being organized by the Pastoral Council. More details are soon to follow.





CATECHETICAL CORNER

Welcome to the Catechetical Corner! Each week, we explore a truth of our Catholic faith – a small seed of understanding meant to help our love for Christ and His Church grow.

How to Make a Good Confession (Especially During Lent)

Lent is a season of repentance and renewal, making it a beautiful time to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Church encourages us to celebrate confession during Lent so that our hearts may be cleansed and prepared to fully rejoice in Christ's Resurrection at Easter. As Scripture reminds us, *"Be reconciled to God"* (2 Corinthians 5:20).

Steps for a good confession:

1. Examine your conscience in prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to help you see where you have sinned.
2. Be truly sorry for your sins and desire to turn away from them.
3. Confess your sins honestly to the priest, including any serious sins and how often they occurred.
4. Receive absolution with trust in God's mercy.
5. Complete your penance and thank God for His forgiveness.

If it has been a long time since your last confession, do not be afraid or embarrassed. Simply tell the priest how long it has been, and he will gently guide you through the process. The sacrament is not about judgment but about encountering the mercy of Christ. The Catechism teaches, *"Those who approach the sacrament of Penance obtain pardon... and are at the same time reconciled with the Church"* (CCC 1422). **Every confession is a new beginning.**

During Lent, the Church calls us to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—and confession strengthens all three. By turning back to God in this sacrament, we make room for His grace to transform our hearts and help us live more fully as His disciples.

Prayer:

Lord, give me the courage to seek Your mercy and the grace to begin again. Amen
