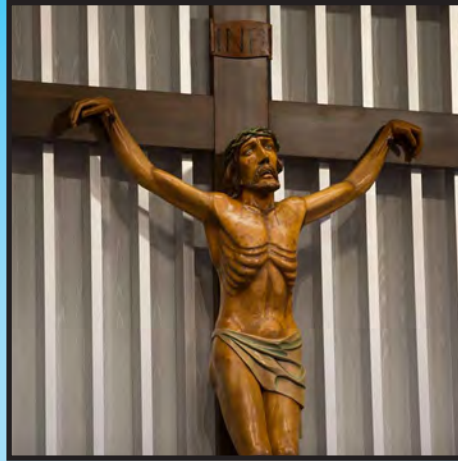

**February 22, 2026 – First Sunday of Lent (A)**

## A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



The First Sunday of Lent presents Jesus' temptation by Satan. The Gospel is intended to be the counterpoint to the first reading, which is the story of the temptation and fall of Adam and Eve in the garden. St. Paul, commenting on them both, reflects on the mystery: "For just as through the disobedience of the one [Adam] man, the many were made sinners, so, through the obedience of the one [Jesus], the many will be made righteous."

What was Satan offering? Bread? But Jesus had multiplied bread to feed 5,000. Power and glory? But Jesus would explain that his Kingdom was "not of this world". Personal safety? Meaningless to one willing to humbly accept crucifixion. Perhaps Jesus had no need for the goods that Satan was offering, but nonetheless, as fully human, like us in all ways but sin, he still had biological and social and even spiritual needs to be satisfied.

The Gospel accounts of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, are read in turn during the three year readings cycle. They are meant to impress upon us during these first weeks of Lent, that the temptation of the Lord was not a mere superficial test. These temptations strike at the very heart of what it means to trust the Father and to have faith. This is the same faith that in the recent weeks of studying the Beatitudes, takes us beyond the mere letter of the Law into living the spirit and fullness of every word that comes forth from the mouth of God. It is a faith that prepares us for the mystery of the Cross.

Jesus' victory in the desert is not only an example, but it is a beginning. He is the New Adam, rewriting humanity's story through new-found obedience. Where the first man fell in a garden of abundance, the New Man stands firm in the desert of deprivation. Where the first reached out to grasp, the second opens his hands in surrender. Triumph is not merely personal— Christ fights Satan as one of us and for us.

This means when we struggle with temptation—the pull of comfort, the lure of recognition, the fear of suffering— we do not stand alone. Christ has already entered the wilderness and faced the adversary. Because he has conquered, we participate in his victory. Lent is not a gloomy season of self-denial for its own sake, but it is a time of training and a sharing of Christ's own forty days in the desert, that his obedience may take root in us through fasting, prayer, and almsgiving.

The desert should not frighten us. It is the place where illusions fall away and faith is purified. It is where we learn that, with Jesus, our deepest need is not bread or power or spectacle, but communion with the Father. When we fall, his victory is our hope and his obedience is our pathway back. Christ's victory over temptation is not merely his story— it is the promise of ours.

**Lenten Regulations:** The Season of Lent began this year on **Ash Wednesday, February 18, 2026** and will end just prior to the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, **April 2, 2026**, when the Paschal Triduum begins. Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year. All Christian Faithful are urged to develop and maintain a program of self-denial, prayer, and the performance of deeds of charity and mercy (including giving of alms), *in addition to* the following *minimal* Lenten disciplines:

• **ABSTINENCE** – Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

• **FAST** – Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

• **To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.** "Seriously sinful" is a moral theologian's code word for "mortal sin," given a person acting with knowledge, freedom, and choice. 'Accidents' are not necessarily mortal sins, but may perhaps be a sign that one is not taking one's Lenten disciplines seriously enough, which may be a separate issue for one's conscience.

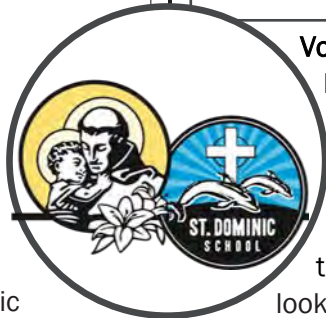
