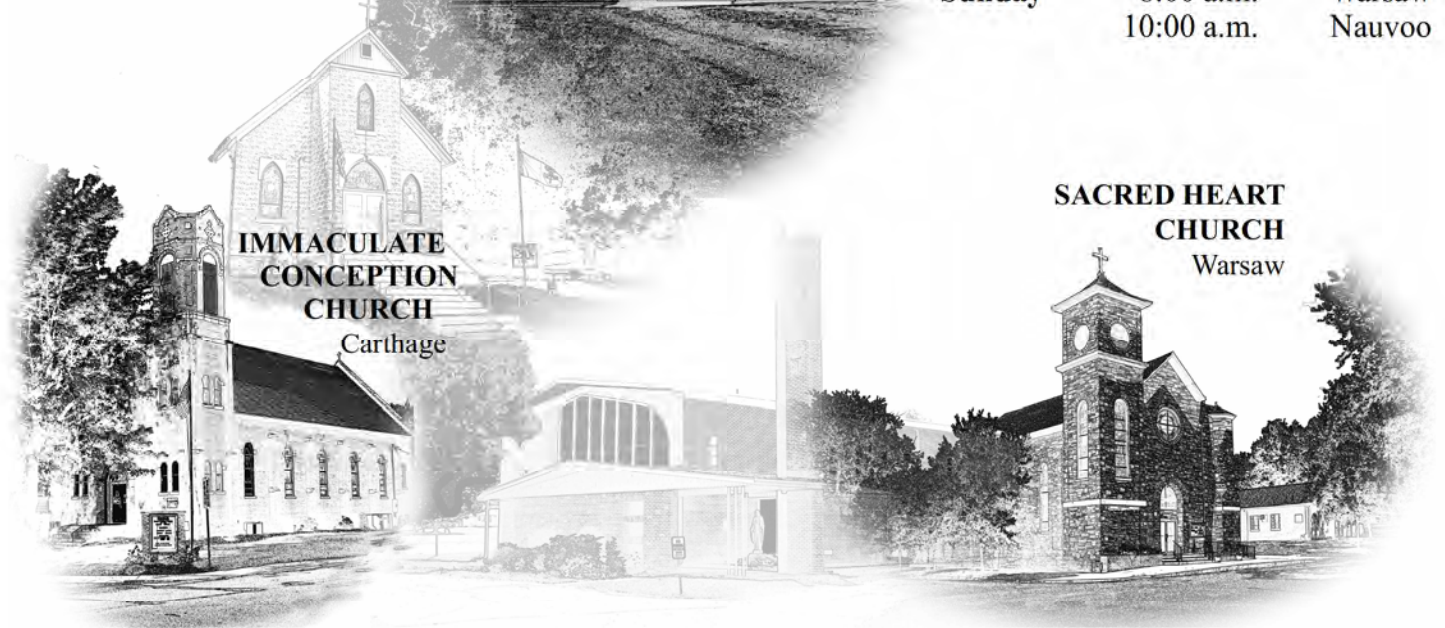

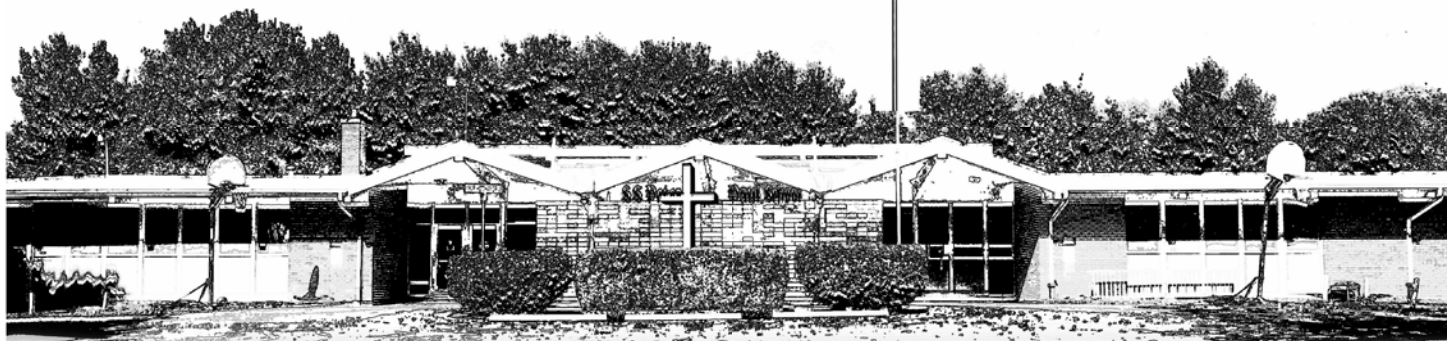

150th Diocesan Anniversary Indulgence and Pilgrimage Sites.

We have until May 22, 2027: that's how much time we have left before the Diocese of Peoria's 150th Anniversary Indulgence to our Pilgrimage Sites ends. Let's say that you wish to travel *all the way* to our own Pilgrimage Site, Sts. Peter and Paul Church in Nauvoo. (The others? St. Mary, Moline; St. Mary, Utica; Corpus Christi, Galesburg; St. John Chapel, U of I; and our Diocesan Cathedral in Peoria.)

An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt have already been forgiven. The authority of the Catholic Church to serve as instrument of this gift comes from Jesus Himself; the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints is communicated through the Church.

An indulgence is either partial or plenary according to the removal of either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. We can receive indulgences for ourselves or for those who have died.

The conditions for receiving an indulgence: to be in the state of grace; to be of a disposition of complete detachment from sin; Confession; Holy Communion; prayers for the intentions of Pope Leo. A period of several days before or after the actual gaining of the indulgence is allowed to satisfy these conditions.

Lent is here in a few weeks!

A most opportune time to enter into this opportunity for grace!

From Many Roots, One Flourishing Tree: A Brief Reminder Before Next Weekend. Our bulletin and our mail will begin to intensify next weekend, as we enter more deeply into our Planned Sacrificial Giving effort, now renewed after a hiatus of several years. Healing Service will take place on Saturday, February 21, at ICC, after the 4 p.m. Saturday evening Mass. The sacraments of Penance and the Anointing of the Sick, the healing ministry of Mr. Roger Shaner, and intercessory prayer to Bishop Fulton Sheen in anticipation of the possibility of miracles advancing his canonization as a saint of the Catholic Church are available during this evening of grace.

A Look Ahead to the Season of Lent. Over many years here, I found it ironic that we would provide Friday evening Masses during the season of Lent, only to have people head straight for the Fish Fry without taking advantage of the opportunity to pray the Stations of the Cross and go to Mass. So, we're going to return to a Friday evening Lenten practice from previous generations in the life of our Church. Instead of Mass, there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, the Scriptural Stations of the Cross, and Benediction on the Friday evenings of Lent. This change also anticipates a future in which Masses will not be as available and flexibly scheduled as they used to be. And don't forget about our Liturgies of the Word, with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and opportunity for Confession, to be scheduled throughout the season of Lent, as we did during Advent.
