Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

FEBRUARY 8, 2026

Isaiah 58:7-10; 1 Corinthians 2:1-5;
Matthew 5:13-16

The first reading is taken from the third part of Isaiah. The setting is the time after the Hebrews had returned from captivity in Babylon. They expected everything to be perfect; they expected the “light” of the immediate coming of the Messiah. But he didn’t come.

The nation lay in ruins, and the people were poor; they almost despaired. The author tells them to share their food, to shelter the homeless, to help their fellow countrymen. *Then* the Lord will restore them; *then* they shall truly see his light!

The second reading reflects Paul’s bitter experience at Athens. There he had tried rhetoric and reason or “wise” argumentation; his preaching fell flat. From then on he resolved to preach only Christ crucified, without eloquence or philosophy. His simple message was truly light for the Corinthians.

The Gospel is from the Sermon on the Mount. In ancient times, there was no pure salt. To flavor food, there was a salt bag with a rock of salt with all its impurities. Eventually, after much use, only the dregs remained in the bag; the salt had been used up. The salt bag was good for nothing but to be thrown out.

We must always be salt, and not dregs! On a pitch-dark night, even a candle seems brilliant. We may not be much, but we can surely let our light shine before others – even if it is only one candle power!

Dear Parishioners,

As we celebrate this new month of February, our thoughts, at least mine do, turn to the thoughts of Spring. I've had my share of winter and look forward to warmer temps, longer days, and new growth on our trees and on our lawns. Unfortunately, our prognosticator of Spring, namely Punxsutawney Phil, sees his shadow and supposedly we now have six more weeks of winter. The interesting part of that prediction is that according to our calendar, we are more than six weeks away from Spring anyway. So, it doesn't matter for we will take what is given to us and be thankful to God for the gift of Creation.

Our readings for this weekend are rather interesting and help us to understand what God expects from each of us. In the second reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he tells us that he did not come preaching "with sublimity of words or of wisdom." But rather what guided Paul was the person of Jesus, and "him crucified." Like most of the evangelists, we come to our people, "in weakness and fear and much trembling, and my message and my proclamation were not with persuasive words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of Spirit and power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God." This short passage is a reminder to all of us who preach the gospel not to be impressed with our persuasive speech, nor our human wisdom, but instead to let the power of God speak through us. I find that we often times just need to get out of the way and let God speak His message through us. If God does that for His priests and evangelists, He also does the same for His people who are the light of the world and the salt of the earth. Jesus is Jesus and you and I just need to open up our hearts and our lives to allow Him to speak through us and in us. If we do that, we will bring light to others and salt to the lives of others.

Just to prepare you with a reminder that the season of Lent will begin on Wednesday, February 18, with our celebration of Ash Wednesday. Our Mass schedule for that day will be as follows: **Mass at St. Peter Church at 8:20, 12:10, and 6:30 p.m. There will also be Mass at QND at 10:00 in the QND gym for those who might be interested. Also, this day is a day of fast and abstinence. Please note that we will have a Wednesday evening Mass during Lent at 6:30 p.m. with Confessions from 5:30-6:20 p.m. Then on Fridays, we will have the same confessional schedule but at 6:30 p.m. we will have Stations of the Cross followed by Benediction. Please begin to think of what Lenten practices and/or disciplines that you will be doing for yourselves as preparation for Easter.**

We are very happy to welcome back this coming week Fr. Paul Lesupati, who has returned to us from his visit with his family in Kenya upon the death of his mother. We missed him and are very glad he has returned to us safe and hopefully refreshed.

Just to let you know that I have been able to move my chemo treatments from Fridays to now Mondays. My next treatment is Monday, February 9. So if you see me looking tired and fatigued, it's not the disease but the chemo. These treatments will continue every other week until sometime in April when I will have another evaluation by Siteman Cancer Center at Barnes Hospital.
