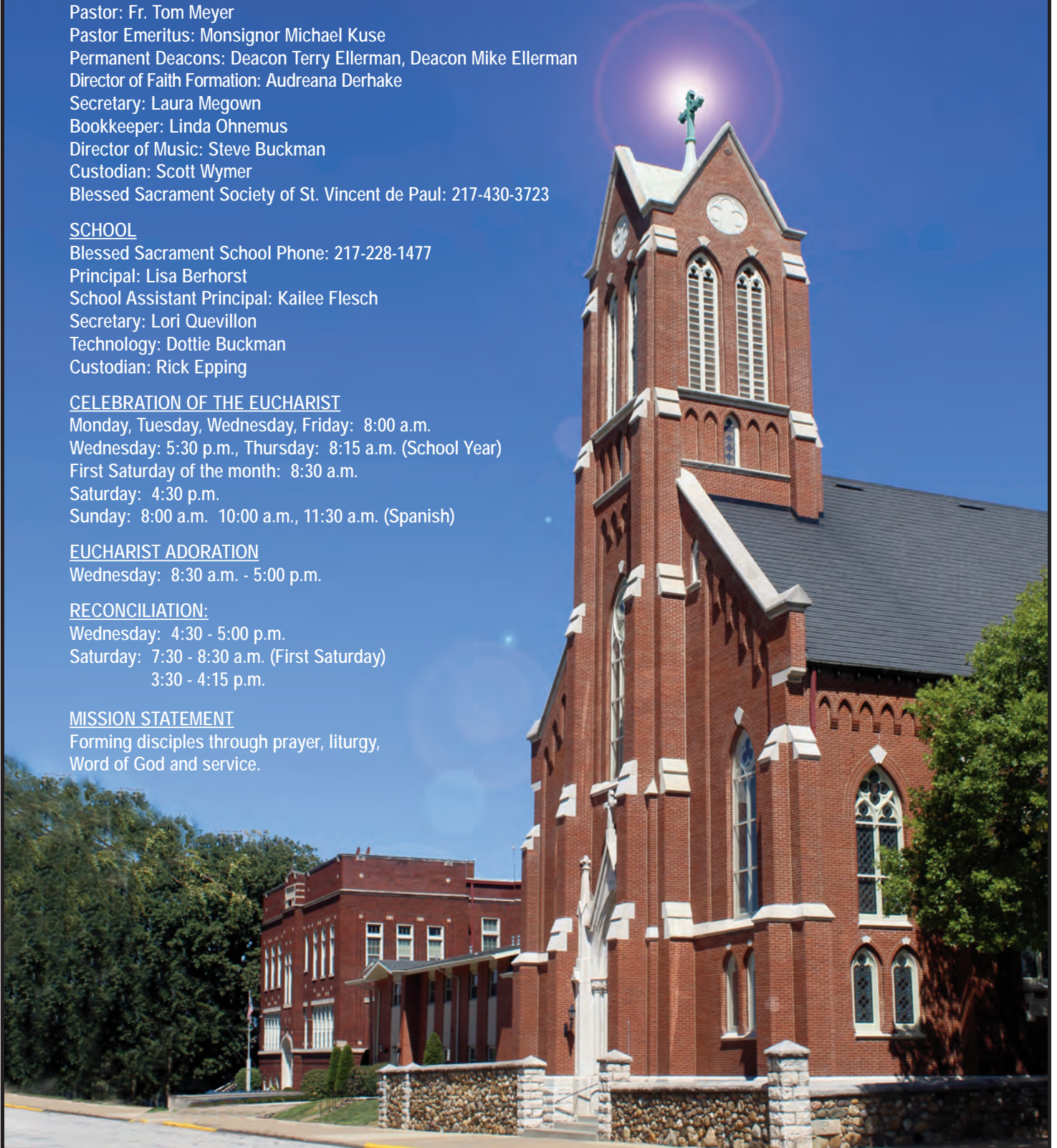

Today we celebrate the **2nd Sunday of Lent**. In the gospel we hear the story of the Transfiguration. Jesus is transformed before his disciples in order to strengthen them for the challenging journey ahead. This is a journey that will lead to the cross on Calvary. We ask the Lord this Sunday for his continued strengthening during our own Lenten journey of repentance and transformation...a journey that too has its own cross.

This weekend (February 28-March 1) we have our **Annual Collection for Quincy Catholic Charities**. Representatives of our local Quincy Catholic Charities Board are here this weekend to ask for your generosity to this annual appeal. Next weekend (March 8-9) **Quincy Notre Dame kicks off their Annual Fund with a talk at all Masses by current QND students**. 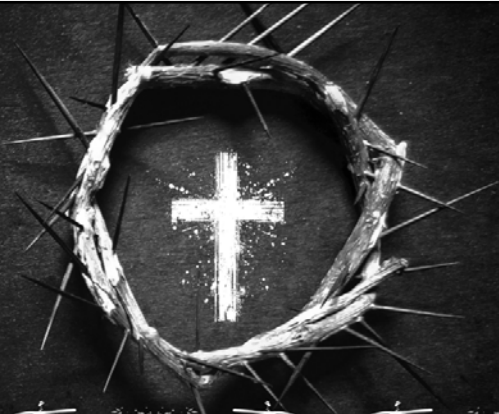

CATECHETICAL CORNER

Welcome to the Catechetical Corner! Each week, we explore a truth of our Catholic faith – a small seed of understanding meant to help our love for Christ and His Church grow.

What the Stations of the Cross Teach Us

During Lent, the Church invites us to pray the **Stations of the Cross**, walking step-by-step with Jesus from His condemnation to His burial. This devotion allows us to meditate deeply on Christ's suffering and love. As Scripture reminds us, *"He loved me and gave himself for me"* (Galatians 2:20).

The Stations teach us powerful spiritual lessons:

- **The reality of sin and its cost** — Jesus' suffering reveals the seriousness of sin, but also the depth of God's mercy.
- **The meaning of sacrificial love** — Christ freely embraces the Cross for our salvation.
- **Perseverance in suffering** — When Jesus falls and rises again, we are reminded that failure is not the end.
- **Compassion and courage** — Simon of Cyrene and Veronica show us how to help carry one another's crosses.

The Catechism teaches that by uniting our sufferings to Christ, they can take on new meaning (cf. CCC 618). Praying the Stations helps us see our own trials in light of His Passion and trust that suffering, when joined to Jesus, **leads to resurrection.**

At our parish, the Stations of the Cross are prayed every Friday of Lent following a free dinner provided by the parish, and Fr. Tom offering reflections on The Passion from the Gospel of Matthew. All are invited to come pray, reflect, and walk this sacred journey together. Printed copies of a beautiful meditation on the Stations—shared with us by our **Advent Mission speaker, Patty Schneier**—are also available in the gathering space for personal or family prayer. The Stations are not only about remembering what happened long ago—they help form our hearts to love as Christ loves: faithfully, humbly, and completely.

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, help me to walk with You in Your Passion and to carry my cross with faith and love. Amen.
