Second Sunday of Lent

MARCH 1, 2026

Genesis 12:1-4a; 2 Timothy 1:8b-10;
Matthew 17:1-9

Remember that Lent is devoted to baptism and baptismal renewal. Last week we saw that baptism does not mean freedom from temptation. As the Lord was tempted, so will we be tempted. We must daily struggle to overcome.

This week we see the profound meaning of our baptism: Through baptism, we are transformed into the image of Christ himself! But don't expect that everything is "glory."

Only once during his earthly life did Jesus allow his divinity to shine through his humanity. He was transfigured before three of the apostles. At all other times he looked like an ordinary human being. We may not "see" our divine baptismal dignity, but it is there; and we must reverence that image with humility and gratitude.

Our first reading tells of the call of Abraham. All nations and peoples will be blessed through a descendant of his. Abraham's call was great; our call to baptism is greater. We share in the blessing promised to him.

Our second reading tells us that the Gospel will also mean hardship. Jesus was divine; yet he suffered and died on the cross. We share his divine life; and we, too, must carry our crosses in union with him. Let us not rebel against our daily crosses; let us bear them joyfully.

The experience of the Transfiguration was intended to strengthen the disciples for the ordeal of the cross. It was to help them to see that the Messiah was not the triumphant and over-powering person expected, but was a suffering Messiah. If we want to follow Christ, we must follow him in his cross as well as in his resurrection.

Second Sunday of Lent, March 1, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

Well, we have brought to an end another month of the year. I bring this to your attention as we are getting closer to our season of Spring. For me, it cannot come soon enough. I am tired of the freezing temperatures and am ready for warmer weather.

We gather this weekend to celebrate the 2nd Sunday in our season of Lent. Last weekend, we heard about the temptations of Jesus. These temptations seemed to hit the very identity of Jesus. The devil would say to Him, "If you are the son of God, you can turn these stones into bread and feed yourself." Or again, "If you are the son of God, throw yourself down." The devil was tempting Jesus to be the Messiah that people wanted or expected, and Jesus would not have anything to do with it. Instead, Jesus' response was "Get away, Satan." Well, this weekend we hear of the identity of Jesus only this time as the Son of God. In our gospel, Jesus takes his apostles, Peter, James, and John, and led them to a high mountain by themselves. "And He was transfigured before them; His face shone like the sun and His clothes became white as light." In this experience the identity of Jesus was fully revealed to these apostles. In light of this experience, these apostles would be strengthened to face the struggles, difficulties, and crosses that would confront them in the weeks ahead because they knew Jesus was the very Son of God.

For many of us we have had mountain top experiences in which we experienced the identity of Jesus in a special way. These experiences could be retreats, such as TECs or Cursillos. It is afterward that we don't want to come back to reality and would much rather stay with this mountain top experience. But like the apostles, we too must come down from the mountain top experience and embrace whatever cross or difficulty that might confront us. But like the apostles, we are strengthened by this experience to endure whatever lies ahead. May each of us who have experienced the identity of Jesus as the Son of God in various experiences feel the grace of God in our midst as we embrace Jesus and live His life and His love.

Since almsgiving is a part of our Lenten practice, I ask you to be generous in your support of Catholic Charities. They do valuable work in our area, assisting the poor with many differing programs, as well as others who are in need of their services, from counseling to other programs that without them, our people would not be served. So please be generous in your support. Thank you!

CELEBRATING AND SUPPORTING ELLIE LAMBERSON

On March 2 our students will support one of our students—Ellie Lamberson by wearing bright colors or purple out of dress code tops and bottoms. Ellie was born with Crouzon's, which is a rare form of Craniosynostosis. The condition only affects the bones in her mid-face and skull. This caused her sutures to prematurely close as an infant. At the age of 2, she underwent Chiari Decompression Surgery and a Cranial Vault Reconstruction in order to open her sutures and allow her brain more room to grow. She has annual MRI's and sleep studies to monitor her progress. Her most recent MRI indicated increased cranial pressure, which means she will have to undergo a 2nd Cranial Vault Reconstruction. If the increased cranial pressure is not relieved soon enough, this could result in loss of eyesight. She will be traveling to Dallas, TX this coming Spring.

We are coming together as a school family to support her.






