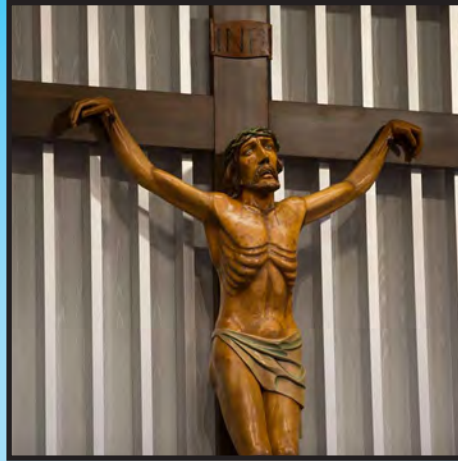

March 15, 2026—Fourth Sunday of Lent (A)

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



The **Fourth Sunday of Lent, Laetare Sunday**, gains its title from the proper Entrance Antiphon (also called the Introit) that belongs to the Mass: “Rejoice, O Jerusalem, and gather together all you that love her...” The modestly-festive nature of the weekend compared to the other weekends of Lent is a reminder, first, that Lent is now more than half over. Secondly, it is a reminder that, even in this season of penance, we have much to rejoice in, for the victory over sin and death is already won. The completion (and perhaps even the intensification) of our Lenten disciplines is simply an opportunity to further strengthen our minds and hearts to recognize and embrace God’s graces anew at Eastertime. Renewing our commitment to keeping the entire length of the Lenten fast will also help us to sustain our Easter celebration over the entirety of the fifty days that follow Easter Sunday.

The **Man Born Blind** is presented to us from the Gospel of John this week, the second of the “Lenten Tryptic”. The man born blind represents all who are burdened by the weight of human frailty imposed by our nature as created beings. The man had never had the ability to see, and thus was sidelined from work, family, even the practice of the faith. Jesus’ intervention is not exactly ‘healing’ or ‘repair’, for the man had never had sight before... it is instead a new creative act of God’s will and generosity... to enlighten the man’s eyes and mind where before had only been darkness. This enlightenment reminds us that our encounters with God are ultimately transformative, revealing new gifts and abilities where they had not been before. Such encounters are not simply restorative or evocative of latent abilities that are simply dormant, but a transformation of the life and receptivity of the human heart to the light of God’s presence.



St. Anthony of Padua Church and St. Dominic School announces an opening for a new position which I am tentatively calling: “Director of Parish Outreach and Engagement”. This job and ministry, reporting to the pastor, is intended to expand our Stewardship, Mission, and Ministry outreach efforts to our parishioners, taking charge of activities such as *Communio*, youth ministry, the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA), Vacation Bible School (VBS), liturgical ministry training and scheduling, the organization and support of small faith-sharing groups, as well as coordinating more formal programming for adult religious formation. This role may be available to assist in religious education ministries at St. Dominic School and with the parish-based Families of Faith programming, but is formally separate from these efforts. Finally, the employee would be a liaison for our upcoming Centennial Campaign, receiving guidance from and providing assistance to our professional Campaign directors. This will be a half-time to full-time position, and the applicant should be an active, participating member of St. Anthony parish. Expected salary range will be \$20-45k depending on part-time or full-time status, and will also include for FT employees, eligibility for diocesan benefits, summarized here: <https://dio.org/wp-content/uploads/2025/01/Benefits-Flyer-1.pdf>. Please provide a letter of interest as well as a resume to the parish office. The application window will close on April 1 or when the position is filled. As many of you may know, Bob & Dorothy Haley (St. Anthony parishioners) lost their home and all of their belongings in a house fire.

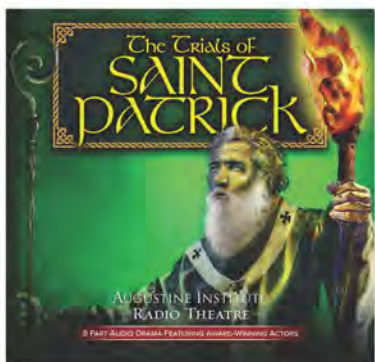
