Fifth Sunday of Lent

MARCH 22, 2026

Ezekiel 37:12-14; Romans 8:8-11;
John 11:1-45 or 11: 3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45

In Jewish expectation, the most obvious sign of the coming of the Messiah was the resurrection of the dead. Hebrews did not distinguish between “body” and “soul;” those are Greek philosophical categories. To the Hebrews, a human person was an animated body; if there was to be life after death, it had to be by way of the resurrection of the body.

Early Judaism knew nothing of life after death; late Judaism developed the idea of life after death because of the expectation of the Messiah. The Messiah would bring an era of perfect joy to this earth. The living would live forever. But what about the dead? They thought that it would be unjust of God not to raise the righteous who had died before the Messiah came.

The expectation is expressed in the first reading. In the Gospel, the seventh and last of Jesus’ “signs” is the raising of Lazarus. But note that this is a sign of our own resurrection to glory. Lazarus would die again. But those who believe in Jesus will never taste eternal death. Jesus promises that he has conquered death. Whoever lives and believes in him will conquer any fear of death; he is assured that he will live forever in the glory of Christ.

In the second reading the contrast is made between “spirit” and “flesh.” “Spirit” here does not mean “soul,” and “flesh” here does not mean “body.” Here, “flesh” means the entire human person considered as living without Christ; i.e. the human person under the reign of sin.

“Spirit” means the entire human person considered as living under the reign of Christ. A good synonym for “spirit” would be “grace.” Because we live in Christ (in grace) we shall live forever; we shall rise from the dead bodily because we share the life of Christ spiritually.

If we share with Christ, we must show this in our lives. We must show by our attitude, our words, and our actions, that we believe that we have conquered death; we must be a people of joy who radiate the power of Christ’s love.

Today we celebrate the third and last of the Scrutinies with our Elect. The emphasis is on the resurrection which they will experience in their baptism on Holy Saturday. With them, let us pledge that we shall daily die to self and that we shall daily rise to share the life and love of the risen Christ. Our share in the resurrection of Christ in this life is our life of grace.

Fifth Sunday of Lent, March 22, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

“Once upon a time it was the tradition to cover all crucifixes, statues, and pictures in purple cloth from two Sundays before Easter until Good Friday. Those were the days when the Fifth Sunday of Lent, one week before Palm Sunday, was called *Passion Sunday*. The veiling referred to the closing words of the Sunday’s Gospel, ‘they picked up stones to throw at Him, but Jesus hid Himself, and went out of the temple.’ The Lenten veil also expressed the sorrow of the Church at this time. As a matter of fact, the Roman Missal still says, in a note about the Saturday of the fourth week of Lent, that this tradition may be observed, continuing the veiling until the beginning of the vigil.” (The Catholic Source Book).

As we continue to prepare our Elect for the Easter sacraments, and as we prepare to renew our baptismal promises at the Easter Vigil, the Church this weekend uses John’s gospel concerning the death of Jesus’ friend, Lazarus. The whole purpose in using this particular reading is the statement that Jesus states boldly that “He is the resurrection and the life; whoever believed in Him, even if that person dies, will live; and everyone who lives and believed in Jesus will never die. Then Jesus asks, Martha the question he poses for all of us, namely, “do you believe this?” Well this question is what the Paschal Mystery is all about, namely, Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection. This is our faith, this is what Easter is all about. Do you believe this? Hopefully we will be like Martha and are able to say and renew each Easter, “Yes, Lord, I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world.”

Now to illustrate Jesus’ words to Martha and to us, we find Jesus going to the tomb in which they buried Lazarus. And then we hear how the humanity of Jesus seemed to come forth at the thought of the death of Jesus’ friend, and all the gospel tells us that “Jesus wept.” Sadness and sorrow take hold of the humanity of Jesus as it does all of us, and tears are shed. But there were skeptics who thought to themselves, “could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?” After reaching the tomb, Jesus tells them to remove the stone that lay across it. There was concern that since Lazarus had been dead for a number of days that there might have been a stench. But to prove Jesus is who He told Martha He was, He prayed to His Father and then in those remarkable words of power of life over death, Jesus cries out and says, “Lazarus come out!” And Lazarus did come out as directed, tied hand and foot with burial bands. And Jesus says “untie him and let him go free.” The words of Jesus echoed over and over at the tomb and many began to believe in Him. This story continues to ask that same question that Jesus asked of Martha “do you believe that Jesus is the resurrection and the life?” The raising of Lazarus is proof that Jesus is who He says He is. This is the Easter Mystery. This is the mystery that helps us realize that death has no power over Jesus, nor His promise to all those who acknowledge Him as our Savior.

Because of this gospel, we will have the third and final scrutiny for our Elect. Our prayer for this scrutiny has to do with death and resurrection, new life in the Sacraments, and that our Elect will receive the new life of the Risen Christ and bear witness to it.
