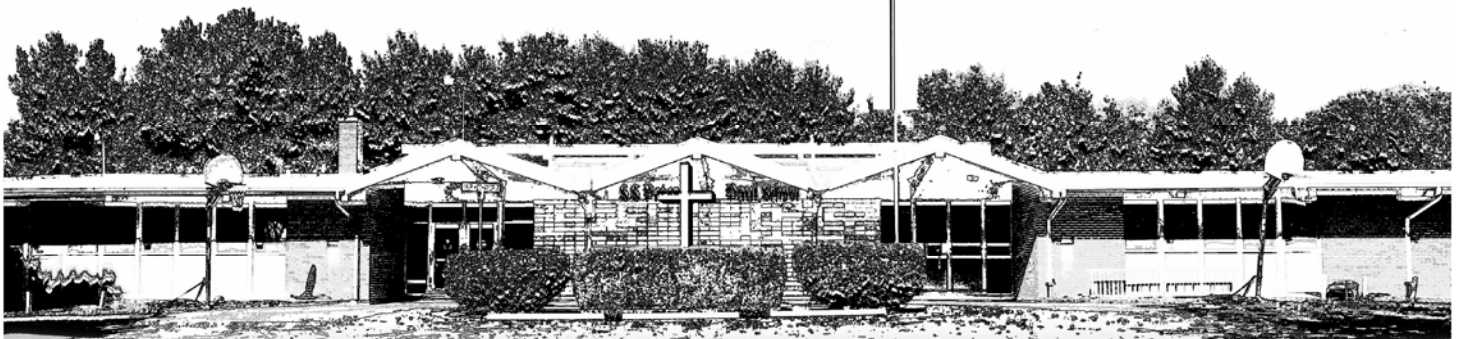

Divine Mercy Sunday

We need reminders sometimes. And in the life of faith, the Holy Trinity sends us highly symbolic reminders about dimensions of our faith about which we have forgotten. Like the Sacred Heart of Jesus: no mere attractive statue. St. Margaret Mary Alcoque, in the seclusion of a convent, received vision and messages from Jesus about His Sacred Heart filled with a deep, heartfelt love, at a time when love of Jesus was turning out to be a mere intellectual exercise. We find out that what wounds Jesus the most is the indifference to what he suffered for us on the Cross, and what He provided for us in the gift of the Holy Eucharist. "Sacred Heart of Jesus, make our hearts like unto thine" turns out to be a prayer for every generation.

Today's reminder comes from St. Faustina Kowalska, who received vision and messages from Jesus about the Divine Mercy of His Sacred Heart. In advance of World War II, only a few years after St. Faustina's death, the world was re-awakened to the rescue from sin Divine Mercy can provide up to the last second of life on this earth. Remember the thief who hung on the cross with Jesus? "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus the Divine Mercy: "Amen I say to you, this day you will be with me in Paradise." The Sacred Heart of Jesus points to the Eucharist; the Divine Mercy proceeds from the Eucharist to the forgiveness offered in the Sacrament of Penance, the gift of Confession of sins. We need reminders sometimes. In case you haven't noticed.... Fr. T.

Church decorations, music, servers, lectors, liturgical ministers, and all who participated: and even the wind on Holy Thursday! It was like the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Sunday! Welcome, Ben Schweizer, Samantha Hopp, and Selena Hamilton, to the fullness of the Catholic faith! The Easter season is seven weeks long, all the way to Pentecost Sunday. Let's make the most of the graces available to us during this time devoted to our Lord's Resurrection.

This Weekend We Celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, April 12. At the hour of Jesus' death on the Cross (3:00pm, the Hour of Mercy), Sts. Peter and Paul Church site of Holy Archangels Parish will host our Hour of Mercy. Readings from Scripture, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and opportunity for Confession (the Sacrament of Mercy) comprise the Hour of Mercy flowing from the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Divine Mercy Incarnate. A tremendous opportunity for grace, here! Make it a point to come!

From Many Roots, One Flourishing Tree: What a Response! Take a look at this; then pay attention to the observation at the end of this information. Out of 224 from our Donor Group Count, 96 responded. Out of 247 from our Non-Donor Group Count, 32 responded. 20 One Time Gifts. *This is a 64% increase over previous donations from 127 respondents: an increase of \$105,746 from previous donations based on respondents, with \$17,580 from one time gifts. Can't thank you enough!* Now: without guilt tripping anybody - remember, we've said what St. Paul said - we don't want anyone to give at the expense of impoverishing yourself - but think about this....The Donor Group Count amounted to 42%; Non-Donor Group Count? 13%: of the number who could have responded. Suppose that 42% could reach even 50% or that 13%, 20%? Suppose we allay suspicions that our gifts would be totally swallowed up by our school. Just imagine what we, as Holy Archangels Parish, could do. Something to think about.

Annual Diocesan Appeal Update. Holy Archangels Parish ADA goal is \$104,137. \$54,135 has been pledged; \$49,260 has been received. Based on what has actually been received, we're looking at \$54,877 to reach our goal. Considering our path of the past several years, it might be difficult to want to remember this: but we *are* a part of the Diocese of Peoria - considering what's happening here in the greater community anatomy, a *very important part*. Thank you for your prayerful consideration of your offering to the Diocese of Peoria for the spread of the Gospel and the faith of the Catholic Church.
