## Second Sunday of Easter

APRIL 12, 2026

Acts 2:42-47; 1 Peter 1:3-9;  
John 20:19-31

Everyone *should* be a saint! By our baptism, we became children of God, heirs of heaven, temples of the Holy Spirit, members of Christ's Body, sharers in God's own life. We *should* always live in accordance with our dignity.

Our first reading describes an idyllic picture of the primitive Church. Everyone shared with everyone else. Very likely this is an overly ideal picture. That's the way the Church *should* work, but unfortunately the Church consists of human beings.

The second reading describes the dignity of our "new birth" by baptism. We are heirs of an imperishable inheritance, but we won't enjoy it fully in this life; it is reserved for us in heaven. Meanwhile, we may have to suffer many things – as Jesus did. This is to perfect and to purify our faith. Let us rejoice even when we are called to suffer for the sake of Christ Jesus.

The Gospel tells of Doubting Thomas. He came to belief because he touched the wounds of Jesus. Jesus says that we are blessed who believe even though we haven't seen.

But there is more to the Gospel. If we fail our baptismal promises through human weakness, we can rise up again. If everything is not perfect, at least it is perfectible. We have "second baptism" – the forgiveness of sins through the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance (Confession.)

Christ gave the power to forgive sins to his apostles and their successors and cooperators, the priests. He forgives us through their ministry. If we find that we aren't perfect, we need to make use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation frequently.

## DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

In these beautiful passages from Acts and the Gospel of John, we are invited into the very heartbeat of the early Church, a community alive in faith, rooted in the apostles' teaching, united in fellowship, and sustained by the breaking of the bread and prayer. This is not simply a nostalgic glimpse of a bygone era; it is a living blueprint for us today. The first Christians were not perfect, but they were intentional. They shared what they had, cared for one another, and found joy in the ordinary rhythms of faith lived together. Their witness reminds us that the Church is not merely a place we go, but a way of life we embrace— one that calls us into deeper communion with God and with each other.

In the Gospel we encounter Thomas, who struggles to believe without seeing. How often we find ourselves in his place, longing for certainty in a world full of doubt. Yet notice how gentle and patient the Lord is. He meets Thomas right where he is, offering not condemnation, but peace. "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." That blessing is for us. We may not see the wounds of Christ with our eyes, but we encounter Him in the Eucharist, in the community, and in the quiet moments of grace in our lives. Like those early disciples, may we open our hearts to His presence, allowing our doubts to be transformed into faith, and our faith into joyful witness.

Also, many of you have noticed that we put a reliquary cabinet in the side of one of the north confessionals. I am still planning on putting name tags for each relic so you know who we have. We are truly blessed to have these relics and I wanted them to be in a more prominent place that was visible but keeps them safe. Please enjoy venerating these great saints and thank you so much to someone for making my vision come alive so well. Happy Easter!

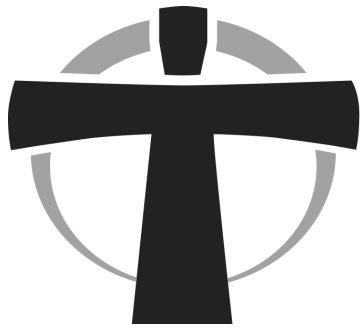
