Third Sunday of Easter

APRIL 19, 2026

Acts 2:14,22-33; 1 Peter 1:17-21;
Luke 24:13-35

One “key word” is found in each of the Scripture readings of today’s Mass and in the Responsorial Psalm. It is the word *path*. (In the second reading and Gospel it is translated “way.”) The conclusion of the first reading is: “You have shown me the *paths* of life.” Our Responsorial Psalm refrain is: “Lord, you will show us the path of life. In the second reading Peter says, “You were delivered from your futile *path* of life... by Christ’s own blood.” In the Gospel, two disciples are on the *path* to Emmaus.

Very likely most of us have experienced a post-Easter let-down. This was in evidence last Sunday when our attendance was about half of what it was on Easter Sunday! Some have gone back to their old *path* of life already. We’ve been on a “high,” and now we settle back down to the drudgery of daily existence. It must not be so! Christ has risen; he is with us! Our *path* of life must be different!

The two on the path to Emmaus were *disciples*, not *apostles*. A disciple is a follower, a learner, one who studies to become like his master. Perhaps these followers did not recognize Jesus because they had never seen him! They followed him because of the proclamation of good news. But now, it seemed as if their world had collapsed; they went down the path to Emmaus in dejection and desperation.

Jesus opened their minds to the Scriptures. But still they didn’t realize his presence. They finally recognized him “in the breaking of the bread.” The Gospel wants us to understand that we encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. “The breaking of the bread” was the ancient name for the Mass or the Eucharist.

The risen Lord Jesus can deliver us from our futile paths of life. He is always present to us in his word and in his sacrament. But we must come out of ourselves to find him. We must look up and out. Let us renew our realization of the presence of the risen Lord each day. And let us realize that he truly will show us the path of life.

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

In today's reading from Acts, we hear St. Peter stand boldly before the people, proclaiming the truth of Jesus Christ—crucified and risen. Not long before, Peter had been afraid, even denying that he knew the Lord. Yet now, filled with the Holy Spirit, he speaks with clarity and conviction: This Jesus, whom they rejected, has been raised up by God, and “of that we are all witnesses.” It is a powerful reminder that God does not call the perfect, He transforms the willing. The Resurrection is not merely an event of the past; it is the living reality that continues to embolden ordinary people like Peter and like us to bear witness in our own time. When we open ourselves to the Spirit, fear gives way to courage, and doubt is replaced with faith.

The Gospel account of the road to Emmaus offers us a deeply personal image of how the risen Christ walks with us, even when we do not recognize Him. The disciples are burdened, confused, and disheartened, yet Jesus draws near, listens to them, and gently opens the Scriptures to reveal God's plan. It is only in the breaking of the bread that their eyes are opened, and they recognize Him. This is the Mass! How often this mirrors our own journey. We may feel lost or discouraged, yet Christ is never absent. He is present in His Word, in the Eucharist, and in the quiet moments of our daily lives. As a parish family, may we ask for the grace to recognize Him more clearly, to feel our hearts burning within us, and to go forth, as the disciples did, sharing the good news with renewed joy and hope.

This coming Sunday, April 26, we will have a unique parish event. It is a presentation on planning for the end of life. Not something everyone wants to think about, but after recent events in my life and the loss of several priest friends, I think making sure our affairs are in order if something would happen is very necessary. This is an informational discussion and presentation on all aspects of planning for the end. No pressure, just info. Funeral home planning, funeral Mass planning, planned giving opportunities, wills, and sacramental discussion for end of life. I am hoping that people of all ages will attend and learn more, but especially if you don't have any aspect of this mapped out. **The event will be right after the 9 a.m. Mass on Sunday, April 26 in the Parish Hall.** There will be brunch refreshments and presentations. Please RSVP by calling the parish office no later than April 22, so we have enough food, materials, and seating set up. Please take this opportunity.

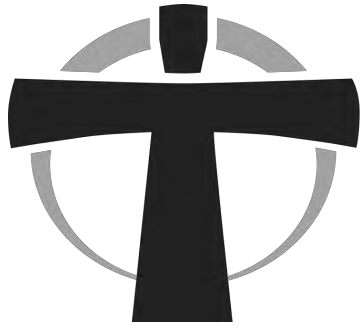
