Acts 2:14a,36-41; 1 Peter 2:20b-25;
John 10:1-10

Today is usually called "Good Shepherd Sunday." But the metaphors in today's Scripture readings speak of Jesus in other terms also. The first reading is the first sermon in the Church; it is given by Peter. He accuses the Jerusalem populace of complicity in crucifying Jesus. He declares that God has raised him from the dead and made him Lord and Messiah.

Peter does not enter into a theological discussion of the pre-existence of Christ, nor of the Incarnation. He simply says that by the resurrection, Jesus effectively is made Lord and Messiah. He is more than the promise made to Israel; he is Lord.

The second reading speaks of Jesus as a lamb led to the slaughter. He did not resist, did not cry out. There are allusions here to the Suffering Servant Songs of Isaiah. He offered himself as the Lamb of God to the Father, and by his wounds, we are healed. Then the author changes the metaphor: We were the straying sheep, but now we have returned to the shepherd and guardian of our souls.

The first part of the Gospel speaks of the shepherd who leads his sheep. The sheep will follow only their own shepherd. Jesus is that Good Shepherd who provides for our needs, who protects us, who binds up our wounds, who searches for us when we are lost, who leads us and guides us. The second part of the Gospel changes the metaphor: Jesus is now the gate of the sheep enclosure. All must go in through him. Elsewhere in John, Jesus says that he is the "way."

Whatever the metaphors, the meaning is clear: The Lord Jesus Christ must be the meaning of our lives. We must see every aspect of our lives in the context of Christ. Our salvation, our forgiveness, our advancement on the way to the Father all come through, with, and in Christ. He is shepherd, Lamb of God, and gate of the sheepfold. He is Messiah and Lord. He is the way, the truth, and our life.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

In the readings this Sunday, we hear the bold voice of Peter standing before the crowds, proclaiming that Jesus—crucified and risen—is both Lord and Messiah. His words pierce the hearts of his listeners, and they ask the question that must arise in every age: “What are we to do?” Peter’s answer is as direct now as it was then: Repent, be baptized, and receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. This is not merely a moment in history; it is an invitation that echoes into our own lives. Faith is not something we inherit passively or admire from a distance. It calls for a response, a turning of the heart, and a willingness to live differently because Christ is truly risen and active among us.

In the Gospel, Jesus describes himself as the gate for the sheep, the one through whom we find safety, nourishment, and life in abundance. In a world filled with competing voices and false promises, it can be difficult to discern whom to trust. Yet the voice of the Good Shepherd is steady and recognizable; it calls us not to fear, but to fullness of life. To follow Christ is not to lose freedom, but to discover it more deeply. As we listen for his voice this week, may we have the courage to enter through that gate, to trust where he leads, and to live as people transformed by the grace we have received.

The door locking mechanism is up and running. The doors to the hall and the wood doors to the church no longer need to be locked or unlocked with a key or dead bolt. During the week the big main west doors will remain locked as the wind often blows them open. Just use any other door. During the school Mass only all the church doors will be locked for safety. On the weekend we will not lock the doors during Mass; but know that there is an emergency lock-down that is possible if needed. Thank you to everyone who made this project possible. Also, soon the glass installation will be finished in the last two doors.

The organ is in the process of being installed. Please remember, if you would like to give to the addition that we are adding to the organ, I would greatly appreciate it. This project will take a couple of weeks to finish. Once all aspects are in then we will be having an organ concert to rejoice at its return and refurbishment.

Thank you to everyone for the birthday wishes, cards, and gifts. I am very grateful for your love and support. Forty-five this last week! Wow! Praise the Lord for another year!

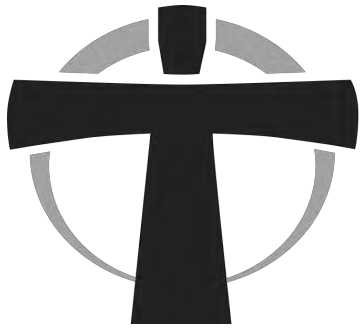
