## Fourth Sunday of Easter

APRIL 26, 2026

Acts 2:14a,36-41; 1 Peter 2:20b-25;  
John 10:1-10

Today is usually called “Good Shepherd Sunday.” But the metaphors in today’s Scripture readings speak of Jesus in other terms also. The first reading is the first sermon in the Church; it is given by Peter. He accuses the Jerusalem populace of complicity in crucifying Jesus. He declares that God has raised him from the dead and made him Lord and Messiah.

Peter does not enter into a theological discussion of the pre-existence of Christ, nor of the Incarnation. He simply says that by the resurrection, Jesus effectively is made Lord and Messiah. He is more than the promise made to Israel; he is Lord.

The second reading speaks of Jesus as a lamb led to the slaughter. He did not resist, did not cry out. There are allusions here to the Suffering Servant Songs of Isaiah. He offered himself as the Lamb of God to the Father, and by his wounds, we are healed. Then the author changes the metaphor: We were the straying sheep, but now we have returned to the shepherd and guardian of our souls.

The first part of the Gospel speaks of the shepherd who leads his sheep. The sheep will follow only their own shepherd. Jesus is that Good Shepherd who provides for our needs, who protects us, who binds up our wounds, who searches for us when we are lost, who leads us and guides us. The second part of the Gospel changes the metaphor: Jesus is now the gate of the sheep enclosure. All must go in through him. Elsewhere in John, Jesus says that he is the “way.”

Whatever the metaphors, the meaning is clear: The Lord Jesus Christ must be the meaning of our lives. We must see every aspect of our lives in the context of Christ. Our salvation, our forgiveness, our advancement on the way to the Father all come through, with, and in Christ. He is shepherd, Lamb of God, and gate of the sheepfold. He is Messiah and Lord. He is the way, the truth, and our life.

**Dear Parishioners,**

This weekend we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday. Although most of us could admit that this figure of a Good Shepherd is far from our experiences of rural America. Who among us has ever seen a shepherd let alone a flock of sheep. But in the Holy Land, I have read that the image of sheep following a shepherd was and still is a striking and commonplace experience and thus is used as a image of leadership. Whatever the case, Jesus uses this image of a shepherd and the sheep as a sign of leadership in our Church.

In our gospel for today, Jesus tells us that in the evening, many shepherds would bring their sheep into a designated pen for protection and safety. Since there were many flocks gathered into the pen, the sheep would be in tune with their shepherd's voice and in the morning that shepherd would call them out and they would follow his voice to the next grazing area. As Jesus tells us, the shepherd would enter this "pen" and calls "each by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice." Notice in this image, there is an investment of the shepherd, knowing his own sheep as he leads them. He doesn't drive them but gently leads them because they trust him as they know that this shepherd will keep them safe from all harm and will find them both water and pasture. That my brothers and sisters is the image of a Good Shepherd. As Jesus tells us in John's gospel, "I am the Good Shepherd, I know my sheep and mine know me." Yes, Jesus does know us, but do we know Him? Each and every day, we are challenged to let the Good Shepherd guide and direct us. Our lives are about Him and not about ourselves.

As we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday, this weekend then is quite appropriate to make the announcements of the changes in personnel here at St. Peter. We will be announcing these changes at all of our Masses this weekend. Just let me say that I have considered it a privilege, a grace, and a joy to have been your pastor since January 2011. I thank you for you putting up with my flaws and weaknesses, as I have enjoyed being your pastor for all these years. One of the hardest things that I have had to do is to retire from this role. After 51 years of priesthood, I have realized that I cannot continue in my role as pastor. This cancer and my age continues to fatigue me and I realize that it is not fair to you, that I cannot be the pastor needed for this great parish. People ask me what I will do in my retirement and I can honestly say "I don't know." On one hand, it frightens me but on the other hand, it is probably what I need with my age and health issues. I do plan on continuing living here in Quincy. I consider Quincy to be my home and will continue to be a member of St. Peter Church. I ask you to pray for your new pastor, to accept him as you did me, and to continue to be the sheep of this great flock called St. Peter Church. The new appointments take effect on July 1, 2026. May God strengthen and help us all.
