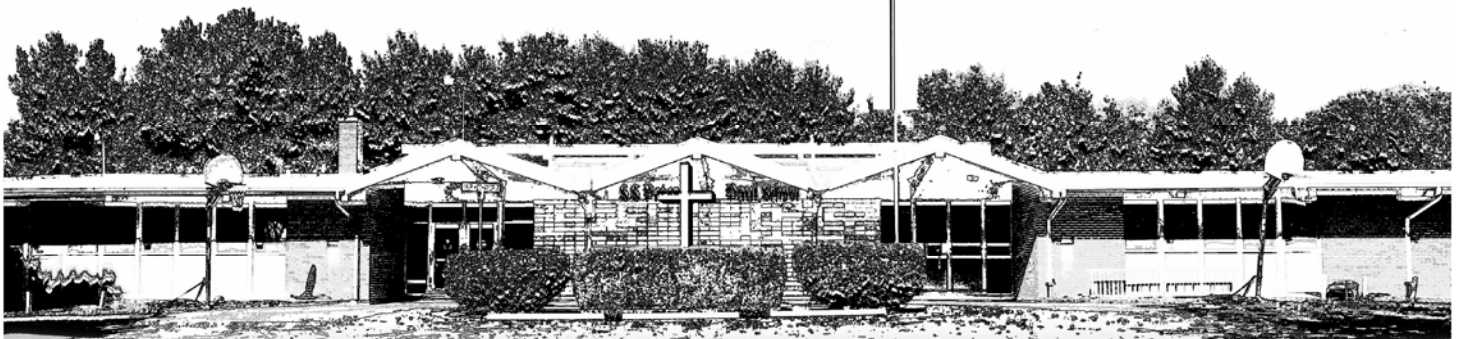

Happy Easter!

It's time for the expression of appreciation and gratitude for all of those who have been involved in any way with the celebration of Lent and the preparation for the Easter Triduum and Easter Sunday itself. The decoration of the sanctuaries of our church sites; the music for our worship; our deacons and adult leaders of prayer during the regularly scheduled periods of Adoration and Confession; the prayers, sacrifices, and works of mercy that all of us offer for the building up of the Body of Christ and reparation for the sins of the world; our own witness to Jesus in the face of suffering - ours, or that of others - and death, with the commitment to make the journey from grief to consolation and peace. Thanks, to so many who didn't let Lent slip by, but really entered into the season to draw closer to Jesus and to each other, and to prepare for Easter Sunday.

But in a far larger sense, our thanksgiving, adoration, and praise go to Jesus Christ himself. Two thousand years "plus" into this new era! One of the consequences of this passage of time is the danger of "sleepwalking" through the greatest mystery of all - the transformation of the human race through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. And we're in it, deeper than deep, every time we participate in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. Thank you, Jesus! (By the way, "Post Christian Era": no such thing. BC Before Christ, and AD Anno Domini," In the year of our Lord." Still in play until the end of time. Come on world: you're lagging way behind, here.)

Easter Sunday Sermon, April 5, 2026

From where you happen to be situated in the church, you might not notice something that happens at every Mass, just before the time of reception of Holy Communion. Even if you do see it, it all happens so quickly that you aren't aware of the sacred significance of what is taking place. After the Our Father and the prayer for peace offered by the priest, the Sign of Peace begins; and while it's taking place, the priest does two things of immense importance. First, he breaks the consecrated Host - the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ under the appearance of bread - in half. And then, immediately after doing this, he breaks a small piece off of one of the half pieces, and places it in the chalice - containing the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ under the appearance of wine. What's actually made present in remembrance, here?

The Body of Christ is "broken" on the Cross in order to be shared with the world; therefore, the Body of Christ in the Eucharist is broken to show how the Lord shares Himself with the world in Holy Communion. That's the "Host broken in half" part! And then: *the fragment of the Host placed in the chalice is the unity of the body and soul of Jesus, indicating the transfigured and transformed existence of the Resurrection.* You aren't receiving a *corpse* when you receive Communion; you're receiving the *once crucified, now and forever glorified* Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ.

Therefore....when you "see" the priest breaking the consecrated Host in half, remember what Jesus did at Emmaus: "When he was at table with them, he took the bread, and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to them. And their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he vanished out of their sight." And when you "see" the priest place the fragment in the chalice, remember Resurrection day: "And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone, and sat upon it....The angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid; for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has risen as he said. Come, see the place where he lay.'"

As a matter of fact, during Easter, we'll actually say these Scriptures, right along with these powerful sacred actions...between the Our Father and the Lamb of God.

I thought it has been long overdue to invite our Latino Catholics to come to Nauvoo for our Spanish Mass at 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 12, and stay for a while afterwards to become familiar with our Villa Marie Rectory! Food and drink will not be refused by the Pastor! Once again: Sunday, April 12, 5 p.m., at Sts. Peter and Paul Church, Nauvoo.

Healing Service: Opportunity for Confession and the Anointing of the Sick, the healing ministry or Mr. Roger Shaner, and intercessory prayer to Bishop Fulton Sheen takes place, Saturday, April 18, at ICC Church Site, after the 4:00 p.m. Mass, at @ 5:15 p.m.

Divine Mercy Sunday is April 12 and Holy Archangels parishioners are invited to join in praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3:00 p.m. at Sts. Peter & Paul Church site in Nauvoo. There will be Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as well as the opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. All are welcome!.
