Resurrection of the Lord

APRIL 5, 2026

Acts 10:34a,37-43; Colossians 3:1-4;
John 20:1-9

The message of the primitive Church was simple: Jesus was the anointed of God (the Messiah) who went about doing good, but was killed by evil people. But God raised him up. In him we have the forgiveness of our sins, and we shall share in his resurrection!

Today's first reading is a sermon by Peter to those who would be the first Gentile or non-Jewish converts to Christianity. The risen Jesus was not seen by everyone, but was seen by many reliable witnesses.

The second reading reminds us that we share in the Lord's resurrection by our baptism. We have died to sin; we have been raised up to grace. So we must now live lives which seek what is above, rather than what is below.

Through our baptism we were called to perfection; most of us have failed. But during Lent we have done penance; we have experienced the Lord's mercy. Now we renew our baptismal promises that we shall be dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

The Gospel seems simple and straightforward. Mary Magdalene tells Peter and John that she has seen the risen Lord. They run to the tomb. The younger, "beloved disciple," outruns Peter, but waits for him. They see the burial garments.

So why do they believe? First of all, because of the empty tomb. The Romans had stationed a guard there so that no one might steal the body of Jesus; yet the tomb was empty. Second, if someone stole the body, they would not take time or trouble to strip off the burial garments.

But third, in the original language, the sentence which we translate "wrappings on the ground" is much more profound! It should be translated that they saw the burial garments "still in their folds" or "still with the contour of the body." If someone had ripped off the burial garments, they would not maintain the contour of a body! But here it was, as if the body had simply evaporated! There could be no other explanation except the resurrection!

So what does this mean for you? If Christ Jesus has risen, the faith is true. There is life eternal. There is forgiveness -- provided that we follow the Lord with all our heart. Let us renew the fervor of our faith and be loyal to Jesus Christ each day.

EASTER SUNDAY

Alleluia! He is risen! In the quiet darkness of that first Easter morning, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb carrying the weight of grief, only to find the stone rolled away and the tomb empty. Soon Peter and the beloved disciple ran, drawn by confusion and hope, and in that simple yet profound moment, the Gospel tells us, “he saw and believed.” They did not yet understand everything, but something had changed. The Resurrection did not unfold with immediate clarity; it began as a spark of faith in the midst of uncertainty. In our own lives, we often stand in that same place seeking understanding, carrying burdens, wondering where God is in it all. Easter reminds us that even when we do not fully see, God is already at work bringing life out of death.

As a parish family here at St. Francis Solanus, we are invited to enter into that same journey of faith. The empty tomb is not simply a sign of what has happened, but a promise of what God continues to do in us. The Risen Christ meets us in our questions, our struggles, and our hopes, calling us forward with quiet assurance. Like the beloved disciple, we are invited to see and believe, not because we have every answer, but because we trust the One who has conquered death. May this Easter renew in each of us a deeper confidence that no darkness is too great, no stone too heavy, and no tomb too final for the power of Christ’s Resurrection. Alleluia!

This Easter bulletin is the perfect place to hit the most people. Please know that Blessing Hospital has a new computer system. In the changeover from the old system to the new, the Church affiliation for everyone was wiped out. When you register for any procedure, make sure you tell them not only that you are Catholic, but that you belong to St. Francis Solanus Church. This allows everyone to better care for your spiritual needs while in the hospital. All those things can only happen if you list St. Francis Solanus as your parish.
