A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Welcome to parishioners, family, friends, visitors, and all who come to worship with us on this most glorious feast of the Resurrection of the Lord! May the light of the Risen Lord shine upon you this day, and all the days of your life, that he may find you ready to enter into the splendor of his kingdom when he comes in glory.

Thank you to all who have made this celebration on Easter special—parishioners, our musicians, liturgical ministers, parish staff, church decorators, sacristans. The many people who make these celebrations possible reflect the glory of the members of the Mystical Body of Christ working together to give praise to God Father in union with the Holy Spirit.

We are diminished by the absence of those who have been baptized into the Body of Christ when they find themselves unable to join us due to sickness, or old age, by past hurts at the hands of the Church or its people, or simply by the distraction by the competing goods of this world. As your pastor, I ask you to continue to help me by bringing to my attention, or the attention of our parish staff, those opportunities that will help us as a parish be more effective in our outreach and reconciliation with those who have fallen away or grown lukewarm in their faith. The work of proclaiming and living God's mercy advances our core purpose given by the Great Commission to teach and preach to all peoples and places. We pray and work everyday to gather our parishioners and equip them to live the faith boldly by assuming their rightful place among God's Holy People engaged in worship, study, fellowship, service, and growth.



In honor of Fr. Irenaeus Kimminau, OFM, whose 106th birthday would have been this week, the parish has established a scholarship fund through Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools Foundation in his name. The goal of this fund is to provide financial assistance to families of students at St. Anthony Parish and St. Dominic School to pursue Catholic Education. Next weekend (April 11-12) we will take a second collection to continue to build this fund. This fund presently holds around \$25,000, which means that annual proceeds are still small at this point, but it is the hope that in the coming years, through collections, funeral memorials and bequests, and other gifts, that we can build this up to provide more substantial support for those who need it.



Normally at this time of year, we celebrate new Catholics who have come into the sacramental life of the Church at Easter. While we did not have candidates baptized and received at the Easter Vigil, we have welcomed a number of new Catholics during the year preceding at other times. The parish office is aware of at least two candidates who are looking at being part of a summer cohort of the 'Order of Christian Initiation' (OCIA), and so on this most holy day of days, I ask our parishioners to consider extending the invitation to become Catholic as we begin the process again. Please inform the parish office of candidates, that we may plan for our next OCIA group. Thank you!

Director of Parish Outreach and Engagement Position



St. Anthony of Padua Church and St. Dominic School announces an opening for a new position which I am tentatively calling: “Director of Parish Outreach and Engagement”. This job and ministry, reporting to the pastor, is intended to expand our Stewardship, Mission, and Ministry outreach efforts to our parishioners, taking charge of activities such as *Communio*, youth ministry, the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA), Vacation Bible School (VBS), liturgical ministry training and scheduling, the organization and support of small faith-sharing groups, as well as coordinating more formal programming for adult religious formation. This role may be available to assist in religious education ministries at St. Dominic School and with the parish-based Families of Faith programming, but is formally separate from these efforts. Finally, the employee would be a liaison for our upcoming Centennial Campaign, receiving guidance from and providing assistance to our professional Campaign directors. This will be a half-time to full-time position, and the applicant should be an active, participating member of St. Anthony parish. Expected salary range will be \$20-45k depending on part-time or full-time status, and will also include for FT employees, eligibility for diocesan benefits, summarized here: <https://dio.org/wp-content/uploads/2025/01/Benefits-Flyer-1.pdf>.
