Resurrection of the Lord

APRIL 5, 2026

Acts 10:34a,37-43; Colossians 3:1-4;
John 20:1-9

The message of the primitive Church was simple: Jesus was the anointed of God (the Messiah) who went about doing good, but was killed by evil people. But God raised him up. In him we have the forgiveness of our sins, and we shall share in his resurrection!

Today's first reading is a sermon by Peter to those who would be the first Gentile or non-Jewish converts to Christianity. The risen Jesus was not seen by everyone, but was seen by many reliable witnesses.

The second reading reminds us that we share in the Lord's resurrection by our baptism. We have died to sin; we have been raised up to grace. So we must now live lives which seek what is above, rather than what is below.

Through our baptism we were called to perfection; most of us have failed. But during Lent we have done penance; we have experienced the Lord's mercy. Now we renew our baptismal promises that we shall be dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

The Gospel seems simple and straightforward. Mary Magdalene tells Peter and John that she has seen the risen Lord. They run to the tomb. The younger, "beloved disciple," outruns Peter, but waits for him. They see the burial garments.

So why do they believe? First of all, because of the empty tomb. The Romans had stationed a guard there so that no one might steal the body of Jesus; yet the tomb was empty. Second, if someone stole the body, they would not take time or trouble to strip off the burial garments.

But third, in the original language, the sentence which we translate "wrappings on the ground" is much more profound! It should be translated that they saw the burial garments "still in their folds" or "still with the contour of the body." If someone had ripped off the burial garments, they would not maintain the contour of a body! But here it was, as if the body had simply evaporated! There could be no other explanation except the resurrection!

So what does this mean for you? If Christ Jesus has risen, the faith is true. There is life eternal. There is forgiveness -- provided that we follow the Lord with all our heart. Let us renew the fervor of our faith and be loyal to Jesus Christ each day.

Easter Sunday, April 5, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

“This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.” Well, today is the long awaited Easter Sunday. As St. Peter witnessed to this resurrection in a powerful sermon that he delivered in the house of the Roman centurion, named Cornelius, so this is the witness that we take to heart in Peter’s explanation of the happenings on that day. In his sermon, Peter says, *“You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him. We are witnesses of all that He did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put Him to death by hanging Him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that He be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with Him after He rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that He is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead.”* This was not only the testimony of Peter on that Easter day but remained the testimony of the apostles, declaring the belief in the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. And so, we utter over and over as the early Church did, *“This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.”*

Once again, I want to thank all those who made our liturgies of the Triduum so powerful this year. This was so evident in the décor of the Church, which seemed to capture the Church’s celebration, to all the various participants who celebrated this one continuous liturgy. And of course, we need to thank our musicians, cantors, and choir along with our servers, ushers, and parishioners who gathered to help us to celebrate our liturgies. Since this will be my last time to celebrate with you the Triduum and Easter, these liturgies had special meaning for me. So, thank you all for your gift of presence for our liturgies.

As I make this transition from an active pastor to a retired one, I ask your prayers as this will be a very difficult transition for me. For over 50 years I have known nothing but being a priest/pastor. This has been a blessing and gift to me. Now to be retired in a couple of months, I’m not sure how comfortable I will be with this transition. But I also know that with my battle with cancer, I cannot do all the things that I want to get done or see that should be done. So, retirement might be a needed alternative. With not knowing what lies ahead, I embrace God’s will and continue to ask for your prayers. I will be living my retirement in Quincy, and you will probably be seeing me around. I have another chemo treatment this Monday, and it hopefully will be my last until I meet with Siteman Cancer Center in St. Louis in a couple of weeks.

Update on our construction: "The roof is on! That means the roof top HVAC units were able to be placed on the roof as well.
