Acts 6:1-7; 1 Peter 2:4-9;
John 14:1-12

The first reading tells of the ordination of the first deacons of the Church. Their primary function is to minister the charity of the Church. The reading tells us that the number of disciples at Jerusalem enormously increased. The Church is growing. In its growth, the Church will need to cope with problems of administration, with answering many questions, and with a deepening awareness of its mission here on earth.

Very likely, the first Christians did not think that the Church would be around very long; they probably thought that Jesus was going to return in glory very soon. Gradually, however, they saw that the Church was intended to be here for the long term. They may have had some fears about this.

But as they reflected, they surely recalled that Jesus had sent the Holy Spirit to empower them to be his witnesses. He had gone to prepare a place for them, but he was still with them. He is the way, the truth, and the life. And the Holy Spirit manifests Christ to them.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells them that they have put faith in him and in the works he has done. But because he returns to the Father and sends them the Spirit, they will do even greater things than he has done! In the power of the Holy Spirit, the Church must continue the mission of Christ until he comes again.

The second reading recalls Psalm 118: Jesus is the stone rejected by the builders who has become the cornerstone, the capstone, of the structure. But it is more than stone: We are living stones being built into God's temple. We need to realize our dignity as the "new Israel."

In Exodus 19:6, God told Israel that it was a kingdom of priests, a holy nation. The author of 1 Peter goes even further: "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people God claims for his very own."

If we are awed and frightened by our mission on earth, let us realize that the Lord is still with us. He has empowered us to be his faithful witnesses through the Holy Spirit. Let us be his instruments in the salvation of the world.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Hello! My name is Andrew Bilgri. I grew up in Quincy, but recently I have been a part of St. Francis Solanus Parish. Two years ago, I was welcomed into this community after I discerned out of seminary. It was quite the transition to return home, but this parish has been a significant place for me to encounter the Lord and to discern God's will. Ultimately, my discernment led to a meeting with Bishop Paprocki and the vocations director on April 23. After prayer and discussion of where I have been and my desire to apply to continue seminary formation, Bishop Paprocki gladly accepted me as a seminarian for the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois!

I will be returning to Mundelein Seminary in August to finish the last three years of seminary formation. In a word, this experience is just like when I used to play football. The First Half of the game can be mixed with triumphs and imperfections. Halftime is when you take a knee and receive inspiration to continue onwards. Well...Halftime is over. The Second Half approaches and my return to seminary will, by God's grace, lead to victory - God's will fulfilled and hopefully my priestly ordination! Keep me in your prayers as I begin again!

How exciting that we have a man from our parish entering the seminary! Let us support and pray for Andrew Bilgri as he begins his studies at Mundelein Seminary. Also, the Diocese of Springfield accepted NINE new seminarians (including Bilgri) for studies this year! This is huge! This brings us to 21! We ordained no priests this year, but we do ordain a man, Padrick Mulligan, to the transitional diaconate as he prepares for priesthood ordination in 2027! Please pray for all our men in formation for the priesthood, but also please keep praying and encouraging more to be priests!

This last week we put out new votive candle stands! We will be transitioning the red electric candles out of use and using these real candles instead. Please don't extinguish candles that are lit. These candles are someone's prayer to remain lit in the presence of the Lord in the tabernacle. The candles are meant for this purpose, the glass globes they are in are meant to be a double precaution, and the metal racks they are in are a triple protection! Please begin using these candles. The larger candle is \$3, and the smaller candle is \$1. Nothing about these votive candle racks, glass globes, etc. are new. All of this was from the attic that we cleaned up, repainted, and restored ourselves.

This weekend's readings are a gentle reminder that the Lord's work unfolds both in the quiet fidelity of service and in the steadfast trust of believing hearts. In Acts, the early Church faces tension not as a failure, but as an invitation, an opportunity to raise up servants who ensure that no one is overlooked, revealing that charity and structure must walk hand in hand. And in the Gospel, Jesus speaks words that have steadied countless souls: "Do not let your hearts be troubled." He does not promise a life without hardship, but He does promise Himself—the way, the truth, and the life. To know Him is to know the Father; to follow Him is to find our path, even when the road is uncertain. So, we are called, each in our own vocation, to trust deeply, serve generously, and believe that Christ is at work in us, accomplishing more than we could ever imagine.

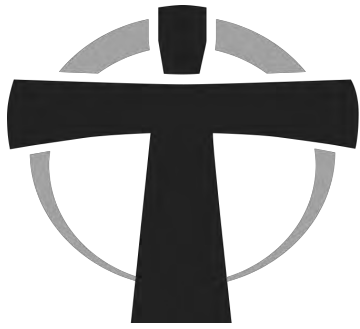
