Fifth Sunday of Easter

MAY 3, 2026

Acts 6:1-7; 1 Peter 2:4-9;
John 14:1-12

The first reading tells of the ordination of the first deacons of the Church. Their primary function is to minister the charity of the Church. The reading tells us that the number of disciples at Jerusalem enormously increased. The Church is growing. In its growth, the Church will need to cope with problems of administration, with answering many questions, and with a deepening awareness of its mission here on earth.

Very likely, the first Christians did not think that the Church would be around very long; they probably thought that Jesus was going to return in glory very soon. Gradually, however, they saw that the Church was intended to be here for the long term. They may have had some fears about this.

But as they reflected, they surely recalled that Jesus had sent the Holy Spirit to empower them to be his witnesses. He had gone to prepare a place for them, but he was still with them. He is the way, the truth, and the life. And the Holy Spirit manifests Christ to them.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells them that they have put faith in him and in the works he has done. But because he returns to the Father and sends them the Spirit, they will do even greater things than he has done! In the power of the Holy Spirit, the Church must continue the mission of Christ until he comes again.

The second reading recalls Psalm 118: Jesus is the stone rejected by the builders who has become the cornerstone, the capstone, of the structure. But it is more than stone: We are living stones being built into God's temple. We need to realize our dignity as the "new Israel."

In Exodus 19:6, God told Israel that it was a kingdom of priests, a holy nation. The author of 1 Peter goes even further: "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people God claims for his very own."

If we are awed and frightened by our mission on earth, let us realize that the Lord is still with us. He has empowered us to be his faithful witnesses through the Holy Spirit. Let us be his instruments in the salvation of the world.

Fifth Sunday of Easter, May 3, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

The month of May has arrived, and one can say it is one of the busiest times of the year. It is a time of commencement, graduations, promotions. It is a time of change, as priests prepare for challenges of a new parish assignment. It is also a time of sporting activities from baseball to softball, from golf to soccer. Needless to say, it is a very busy month for students, parents, and priests. May God help us to be able to settle down and relax during this very busy time.

Our readings for this Sunday continue the theme of Jesus the Good Shepherd. Once again Jesus reminds us He is the Good Shepherd. As that Good Shepherd, He tells us that His sheep recognize His voice. As I was thinking about that metaphor, I liken it to my two dogs that I had as a priest. Both of them were German Shepherds. And I have to admit they both recognized my voice. They should have as they heard me quite often correcting them or calling them from doing something they should not have been doing. I was amazed how they did recognize my voice and how they wagged their tail when I called to them. Even though sheep were a different type of animal, the metaphor whether sheep or dogs is still the same in the sense that it is about the recognition of the voice of the one who cares for them, who feeds them, who corrects them. May all of us be in tune with the voice of the Good Shepherd and we will not be far from the happiness and joy that only His voice will lead us. In our day and age, we have many differing voices that compel us to engage in certain activities, differing voices that tempt us to try certain things; and other voices that could lead to our destruction. When are we going to learn that the only voice that matters is the voice of the Good Shepherd. May that voice always be front and center as we struggle to open our ears to hear it and our wills to follow it.

Last weekend I shared with you about the changes in personnel in our diocese. But I realized that I didn't state the names of the priests involved. First, I am scheduled for a new role in life. After 51 years and 76 years of age, I will be scheduled for retirement. As of July 1, 2026, I will be pastor emeritus of St. Peter Church. All that means is that I am retired. In my place, Fr. Dan Bergbower is our new pastor. Fr. Dan Bergbower was born December 29, 1959, ordained a priest for our diocese on November 26, 1988 and has served as Parochial Vicar at St. Ambrose Godfrey, Our Lady of Lourdes, Decatur, Pastor of Sacred Heart Church, Effingham Illinois, Pastor of St. Peter Church, Quincy, 2004-2008, Chaplain for the Air National Guard, 2008-2012, Parochial Administrator, St. Peter Church, Quincy 2010-2011, Pastor, St. Mary Church Edwardsville, Dean of the Springfield Deanery, and Pastor of St. Agnes Church, Springfield. As you can see Fr. Dan comes to us with a wealth of experience and hopefully will find a home with us. Fr. Paul Lesupati will be leaving us as our Parochial Vicar to become pastor of St. Agnes Church, Springfield and chaplain at Sacred Heart Griffin High School. The parochial vicar assigned to St. Peter Parish is Fr. Gerald Zienna, a priest from the archdiocese of Tamale, Ghana. Please make him feel at home with us here in Quincy. So, we have two new shepherds of our parish. I ask that you open up your hearts and lives for them and assist them as they guide this flock of sheep that we call St. Peter Parish.
