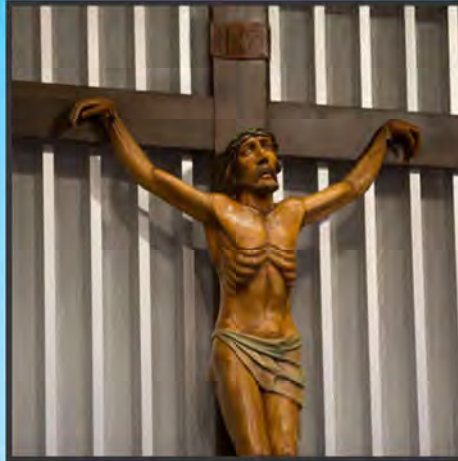

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

I've got a collection of "newsy information" to communicate this week:



Blessing Hospital has a new medical records system which is causing trouble with pastors being able to reliably be informed of patient admissions to the hospital. In time the new database will be modified to allow for access similar to what we had in the past, but for now, it is going to be necessary for those who are in Blessing Hospital to call the parish to inform us that you or a loved one has been admitted. I remind parishioners that we provide the Anointing of the Sick at the hospital in emergencies and on request, and we have a reliable phone voicemail system to deliver those messages. The best bet is always to request the sacrament before it becomes an emergency late at night where it might not be easy or possible to reach a priest. This will be especially important in a couple of weeks when I am out of town for my vacation.



"All are welcome in this place... except..." We have posted 'no trespassing' signs at the entries to the parking lot at church in response to recent events in town where mobs of young drivers congregate in parking lots and elsewhere and cause trouble. We had a recent event as evidenced by all the tire marks on the lot, and the sheriff's office has responded that in order to allow them to take action, we need to have signs posted to allow them to come onto the property and clear uninvited guests. This, of course, is less than optimal when trying to portray an image of a "welcoming worshipping community", but I wanted to communicate what was going on and why those signs are up. I have given the sheriff permission to patrol our lots and take care of business as they see fit, while at the same time I do not expect them to have any issues with evening Mass goes on Saturday (after dark), or the dad who is teaching their kids to ride a bike on our parking lot, or the many other normal things that take place on the lot. If there is any trouble, either for invited guests being given a hard time, or for uninvited guests on

our property please let me know using the parish 'emergency line' on the voicemail system. I also welcome those who see anything suspicious going on at the St. Anthony or St. Dominic campus to independently call the police or sheriff's office to keep our facilities secure and safe.



When the **Pastoral Council** met this week, it was noted that there are **more people kneeling to receive Holy Communion**, and that they found this display of piety edifying. The kneeling posture is, of course, the traditional way that Catholics received Holy Communion for centuries. In recent decades there have been contrasting and conflicting opinions about the proper posture for Holy Communion, and the US Bishops have set as a norm that the faithful typically 'process' to the communion minister, and after making a sign of reverence, typically a bow of the head or maybe the sign of the cross, receive Holy Communion on the tongue or in the hand (while standing), and then receiving from the chalice in a similar manner, if desired and opportune. Our own bishop has had what I would describe as a 'permissive' attitude about posture for

Holy Communion, so long as the minimal norms are followed by all, nobody is criticized or demeaned for choosing to follow minimal norms that some might think are 'less dignified' (i.e., those who kneel should not criticize or demean those who follow the universally-applicable 'standing' norm), and that no behaviors become disruptive, ostentatious, or unsafe (we don't want people falling and unable to get up!) To those ends, and at the advice of the Council, it was suggested that we try making kneelers available to those who wish to use them to receive Holy Communion. We will make this option available for now, up the main aisle, and we will see how it goes.

I have not yet consulted with Fr. Blickhan on this, and I am going to leave it to his judgment, as well as any other visiting priest's judgment as to how to handle this at their own Masses. I don't want this to be something that divides or embarrasses people. If this becomes a problem, we are *always* 'safe' by doing no more and no less than the letter of the law (the norms) prescribed by competent authority (the US Bishops). No sign of reverence will ever be sufficient for us to show our love for our Lord in the Blessed Eucharist. So long as outward dispositions in this matter do not tempt individuals toward pride or vainglory through exaggerated external acts of piety, I see no harm in giving this a try.

There is value to uniformity of motion and posture, there is also value in this traditional form of reverence. Do not feel obligated, morally or socially, to exceed the norms, especially if kneeling for you is hard to do, or if this is simply 'not what you were taught' at school years ago. But if you would like to do so, we will welcome this as an option for Holy Communion at Mass.

When priests visit the hospital they pull a list and will be able to see any of their parishioners who are hospitalized so they can make sure to visit them. This can only happen if you list St. Anthony as your parish.



To all the volunteers who keep St. Anthony running,
we **thank you** and an **important question:**
Are you compliant with Safe Environment?

Per the U.S. Bishops, each parish is required to insure all volunteers are **knowledgeable and compliant** with the Safe Environment policies. It is critical that you check your status now. We are audited in May and need to be compliant. If you are not up to date, take the steps needed. To check you status and get up to date, go to Catholic Mutual Group's website at springfieldil.cmgconnect.org and click **Sign In**. (If you don't have an account yet, fill out the fields under **Register for a New Account**.) Once logged in, your dashboard will show the required training. Click **Start** to begin. Next print, complete, and email the DCFS CANTS Form to safeenvironment@dio.org. You can also get a copy of this form from the parish office. Finally, submit your background check information. Once you account is certified by the Diocese (this may take up to 2 weeks), you will receive an email from webmaster@cmgconnect.org.

You may get an email from us to let you know if your background check has expired but please follow the steps above to check yourself. For any questions or help you may email Janet at bulletin@stanthonypadua.org or call the parish office on Tuesday or Friday, 8 a.m.-1 p.m. Janet will also help you on those days if you don't have access to a computer or need help, Just let her know you are coming into the office ahead of time.
