Sixth Sunday of Easter

MAY 10, 2026

Acts 8:5-8,14-17; 1 Peter 3:15-18;
John 14:15-21

In Hebrew, Greek, and Latin, the word “Spirit” is onomatopoeiac; it sounds like what it means. The word really means “breath.” In Hebrew, it is *ruach*; in Greek, *pneuma*; in Latin, *spiritus*. The concept, of course, is that when a person is breathing, he is alive.

In former times, when a person was in a coma, a mirror or glass would be placed in front of his nose or mouth to see if there was any “breath.” If there was breath, he was alive; if not, he was dead. From this notion, the idea of an animating, life-giving, intelligent and active force came. The word (in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin) thus meant “breath”, “life” and “spirit.” Jewish tradition believed that, when the Messiah came, God’s very own life (breath, spirit) would be poured out upon all faithful believers.

This happened at Pentecost, as we have seen. But it happens also among us. In the Gospel, Jesus promised that he would not leave us orphans; he would send the Spirit of truth, the Paraclete, to remain with us and to be within us. The word “paraclete” means many things. It can mean comforter. It can mean a person who stands by you and helps you in time of need. And it can mean a “defense attorney.” Very likely, it means all these things. The Holy Spirit gives us life, stands by us, defends us, strengthens us, and consoles us.

The first reading tells of the manner in which we receive the Holy Spirit: It is the sacrament of Confirmation. The apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God; the Samaritans had been baptized, but had not yet received the Spirit. The apostles Peter and John were sent to them to impose hands on them so that they might receive the Holy Spirit.

Through the imposition of the hands of the successors of the apostles (bishops), we also receive the Holy Spirit. We are empowered to profess our faith boldly, to bear witness to the truth of the Lord, and to stand for what is right and good. We receive the Spirit’s consolation in our difficulties.

The second reading tells us to be faithful, even when we are misunderstood. Even if others ridicule us and defame us, keep standing for what is right. Keep our consciences clear. It is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong.

Christ did no wrong, but suffered even to death on the cross. If we are willing to suffer for him and with him, God will see us through and will vindicate us. Meanwhile, we have the consolation of the Holy Spirit who lives in our hearts.

Sixth Sunday of Easter, May 10, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

We gather to celebrate the 6th Sunday of Easter. We get a glimpse of the early Church in our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. In that reading we hear of Philip evangelizing the people of Samaria. And the people were filled with joy as they experienced unclean spirits coming out of people and those who were crippled being cured. After hearing the success of Philip, Peter and John were sent to Samaria who “went down and prayed for them, that they might receive the Holy Spirit.” Apparently, those who were baptized were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then the gospel says, “they laid hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit.” One of the signs of the Sacrament of Confirmation was the “laying on of hands.” We find this sign used frequently from the Sacraments of Holy Orders to the Sacrament of Confirmation. Because the people of Samaria did not receive the Holy Spirit at their Baptism, the apostles, Peter and John came and laid hands upon them and they received that gift of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. Thus, they were confirmed in their faith, and they too were then called to a mission of evangelization. For most of us who were baptized in infancy, we too received the gift of the Holy Spirit by our bishop, who is a successor of the apostles. Whether in third grade or often in adolescence, the bishop would lay his hands upon us, then anoint each of us with Chrism, saying to each one of us, “be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.” In that sealing we were challenged to also become evangelizers of the gospel. May that gift of the Holy Spirit enable us to use the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit to preach and teach by our lives that Jesus Christ is our Way, our Truth, and our very Life.

For those who have not noticed, this week we removed the original tabernacle from the Church and replaced it with a temporary tabernacle. This is so that our original tabernacle will be refinished. The last several months, we have refinished our candle sticks on our altars, the Easter candle holder, as well as the processional candle sticks at the side of the altar. The last item is our tabernacle. Nothing has been done to it since it was put into our Church almost 60 years ago. When it is returned, the refinished tabernacle will be a worthy container housing the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. This refinishing project comes to us from the generosity of a parishioner who wishes to remain anonymous. This parishioner saw a need and, like the people of this parish, responded as generous stewards to accomplish this particular need in our Church. On behalf of our parish family, I want to thank him for this completed project.

As we look ahead, our 8th grade students from St. Peter School will be graduating this Tuesday, at 6:00 p.m. in our Church. I ask your prayers for them. I hope and pray that what we have tried to instill in them is a strong Catholic faith, and a strong character to live that faith and share it with others. Then next Thursday, May 14 is the Baccalaureate for Quincy Notre Dame. It will be held in St. Francis Solanus Church at 7:00 p.m. with graduation taking place in the Pit on Sunday, May 17, at 1:00 p.m. Our prayer also goes out to our graduates as we ask God to bless them in their future endeavors and challenge them to live what they learned and the values instilled. May God watch over all of our graduates as they continue their education and be the best of themselves.

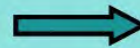
