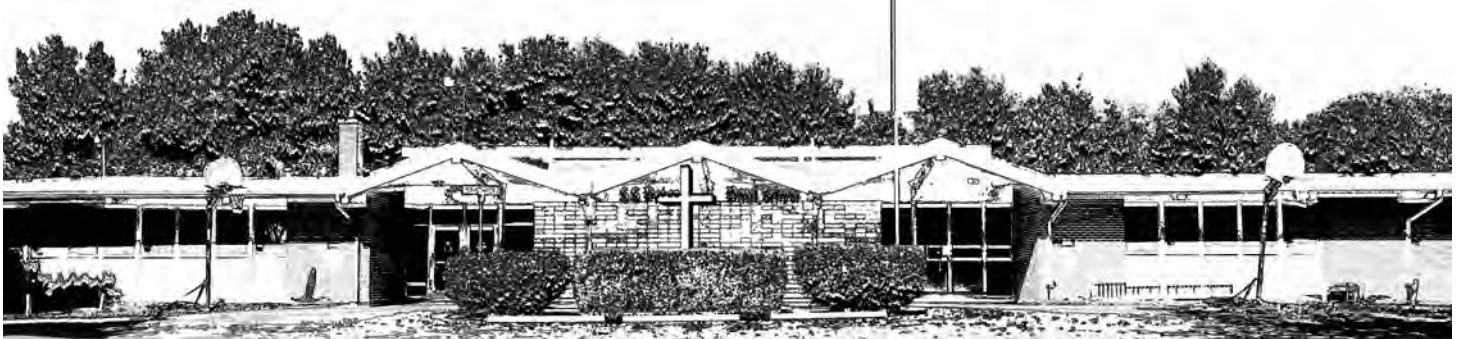

Fr. Paul's 60th Anniversary of Priestly Ordination

Bishop: "Do you resolve to discharge unfailingly, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the office of Priesthood in the presbyteral rank, as a trustworthy co-worker with the Order of Bishops, in feeding the Lord's flock?" *Monsignor Paul E. Showalter:* "I do."

Bishop: "Do you resolve to carry out the ministry of the word worthily and wisely, in the preaching of the Gospel and the teaching of the Catholic faith?" *Monsignor Paul E. Showalter:* "I do."

Bishop: "Do you resolve to celebrate the mysteries of Christ reverently and faithfully according to the tradition of the Church, especially the Sacrifice of the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Reconciliation, for the praise of God and the sanctification of the Christian people?" *Monsignor Paul E. Showalter:* "I do."

Bishop: "Do you resolve to implore with us the mercy of God for the people entrusted to you, with zeal for the commandment to pray without ceasing?" *Monsignor Paul E. Showalter:* "I do."

Bishop: "Do you resolve to be united more closely each day to Christ the High Priest, who offered himself for us to the Father as a pure sacrifice, and with him to consecrate yourselves to God for the salvation of all?" *Monsignor Paul E. Showalter:* "I do, with the help of God."

Bishop: "Do you promise respect and obedience to me and my successors?" *Monsignor Paul E. Showalter:* "I do."

Bishop: "May God, who has begun the good work in you, bring it to fulfillment."

Priestly Promises Renewed at the Chrism Mass.

Bishop: "Are you resolved to be more united with the Lord Jesus and more closely conformed to him, denying yourself and confirming those promises about sacred duties towards Christ's Church which, prompted by love of Him, you willingly and joyfully pledged on the day of your priestly ordination?" *Monsignor Paul E. Showalter:* "I do."

Bishop: "Are you resolved to be faithful stewards of the mysteries of God in the Holy Eucharist and the other liturgical rites, and to discharge faithfully the sacred office of teaching, following Christ the Head and Shepherd, not seeking any gain, but moved by zeal for souls?" *Monsignor Paul E. Showalter:* "I do."

A Personal Remembrance: In the early months of 1978, a young deacon only months away from ordination to priesthood was struggling with doubt and getting "cold feet" about ordination to the priesthood. He couldn't have timed his predicament better! Having worked himself up into major upset, he helped with a Holy Trinity Bloomington High School retreat at the then Henry Retreat House. At a small group session with the retreat leaders present, the young deacon "opened up" about his struggle. There was a priest there, whose few words in the presence of everyone offered an affirmation that eased the doubt: neither too much, nor too little said; just the right thing, with that look, that kind slight smile that let the young deacon know that the priest made a connection, and had reached him where he needed to be reached. I was that young deacon; Fr. Paul was that priest. We've heard his words; we've seen that oh so slight smile, that kindness that has let us know he has connected with us.
