Pentecost Sunday

MAY 24, 2025

Acts 2:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7,12-13;
John 20:19-23

The Greek word “pentecostes” means “fiftieth.” On the fiftieth day after Passover, Jews celebrated the “Feast of Weeks” or “Pentecost.” The celebration commemorated the Covenant of Mt. Sinai. Fifty days after leaving Egypt, the Israelites arrived at Mt. Sinai. There they encountered the Lord in fire and wind and quaking. There the Lord gave them his Holy Law, and they pledged that they would be loyal to him.

At the time of Jesus, this festival also had “overtones” of the inclusion of non-Jews (Gentiles) in salvation. They believed that somehow the Lord would bring all peoples and nations to worship him at his holy temple.

With this background, we can appreciate the powerful coming of the Holy Spirit fifty days after Easter. The “signs” of quaking and fire recall the covenant of Sinai; this is the inauguration of the new covenant! The apostles had expected that everything would be perfect when Jesus came again in glory.

He comes in the Holy Spirit with power and changes timid men into bold men; he changes the crass into the wise; he changes the weak into the strong; and the sinful into the holy ones. They are not perfect, but they are to be the loyal witnesses to Christ. They go forth to proclaim that salvation has come to all peoples. The various groups mentioned in the first reading are a summary of all the peoples known in the Mediterranean world.

The Church is made up of imperfect people; otherwise there would be no need for the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance described in the Gospel. But we are empowered by the Holy Spirit to become faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ. Each of us has received unique and distinct gifts of the Holy Spirit. The Lord calls us to use these for the common good and for the building up of the Church in the unity of love.

Let us rejoice in this “birthday of the Church.” Let us renew our commitment to use our gifts to spread the good news of Jesus Christ to every person.

Pentecost Sunday, May 24, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

“Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you shall renew the face of the earth.

Let us pray: Lord by the light of the Holy Spirit, you have taught the hearts of the faithful. In the same Spirit help us to relish what is right and always rejoice in your consolation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.”

This simple and direct prayer to the Holy Spirit is quite appropriately prayed on this Solemnity of Pentecost. Today is the day that this Holy Spirit came upon the apostles in that upper room appearing to them as tongues of fire. As a result of being filled with the Holy Spirit, they began to speak in different tongues as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. And the people were astounded and in amazement as they heard them speaking in his own language. What disunified people and language now, because of Pentecost, unifies them once again. And thus, the Church is born. And so today we celebrate the birthday of the Church.

In our creed, we proclaim that the Holy Spirit is the “giver of life.” The Holy Spirit is the very breath of God. We hear in our gospel for this weekend that Jesus breathes on the apostles and prays, “receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained.” With that breath of God in the lives of the apostles, they now had the power to forgive sins, to reconcile people, and to bring healing. This is the Church and this is our mission, and why we are sent into the world. May that Holy Spirit fill our lives so that we can continue to preach, teach, and to sanctify and thus establish God’s kingdom here on earth.

This past week was a little bittersweet in my life. I celebrated my last school Mass with our children last Wednesday. As I looked around, I was so very thankful to God for bringing me to St. Peter in Quincy. The faculty over these past 15 years have been a true blessing to me, competent and professional. I also owe a debt of gratitude to Mrs. Cindy Venvertloh, our principal, who has carried much of the burdens of operating a school in a competent and professional manner. She too has been a blessing and am sad to see her leave but understand. Even though I will not be working hand in hand with our new principal, Mrs. Chris Reichert, I know that I leave our school in very capable hands. To all of our other personnel, I thank you for making it easier for me to be pastor of this large parish. We have so many people gifted with much talent that I hope our parents will appreciate what their children receive by attending St. Peter School.

This Monday, May 25, we will be celebrating our annual all city Memorial Day Mass at Calvary Cemetery at 9:00 a.m., weather permitting. If the weather is raining, or perhaps too muddy, we will move this Mass to St. Peter Church. But if the weather is nice, I invite you to bring your lawn chairs and/or blankets and join us as we pray for our deceased, especially for all our war veterans who have died in differing wars. I also ask you to remember our cemeteries with your donations. Envelopes are provided in your packet of parish envelopes. Monies collected help to defray costs of much needed future projects.
