Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

MAY 31, 2025

Exodus 34:4b-6,8-9; 2 Corinthians 13:11-13;
John 3:16-18

The first reading describes the awe experienced by Moses as he encountered the Lord on Mt. Sinai. The Lord is in the “cloud of glory.” No one was permitted to go with Moses. Moses confesses the unworthiness of his people, but asks the Lord to go with them. But, we may ask, how can we approach the awesome Lord? Even when he tells us that he is the God of love, who are we that we can come before him?

The answer is in the Gospel: We can approach the Father through the Son, for “God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son.” He did not send the Son to condemn, but that all might be saved through him. If we have seen the Son, we have seen the Father. We can approach the Father through the Son who became one of us – like us in all things except sin.

But the Son has returned to the Father’s glory. Still, we are not alone. He has sent the Holy Spirit into our hearts. The Holy Spirit makes present the Son; he unites us in the one Body of Christ, the Son.

The word translated “fellowship” in the second reading really means “union with.” United in the Holy Spirit, we are united with each other and made one in Christ, through whom we can approach the Father.

Our spiritual life must be rooted in the mystery of the Trinity. Our prayer and worship are offered to the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit with Mary and all the saints. Give glory to the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit!

The Most Holy Trinity - Solemnity, May 31, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

As we gather this day for our Eucharist, we are celebrating our last weekend in our month of May. School is out and we are in the midst of summer vacation. I hope and pray that it will be a time of refreshment and enjoyment as each of you finds time to relax and have fun doing nothing. Although I am sure that doing nothing will involve you in something that will take your time and energy. Whatever the case, try to enjoy yourselves.

With our celebration of the Solemnity of Pentecost last weekend, the Church has returned to what is called Ordinary time. "Ordinary Time" in our Church calendar refers to the time of the year that does not have a distinctive character, thus no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is being celebrated. During "Ordinary Time" the mystery of Christ is honored in its fullness. However, even though we have started "ordinary time", the first weekend after Pentecost celebrates the Solemnity of the Trinity. In this particular Solemnity, we profess the following in this Dogma of faith:

1. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are one and the same God.
2. The divine Persons are distinct from one another.
3. The purpose of the divine missions of the Son and the Holy Spirit is to bring us to share in the life, light, and love of the Trinity.

The 31st of May is always a special time for me as it is the day I was ordained to the priesthood of the diocese of Springfield in Illinois, 51 years ago on this day. I was ordained with another classmate by Bishop William A. O'Connor at the Cathedral in Springfield. It was right after this ordination that the Bishop let me know that I was heading to Our Saviour Church, Jacksonville, as their new parochial vicar. My first Mass was at Blessed Sacrament Church, Springfield, the very next day. Needless to say, the grace of God was a continual help for the next 51 years of my priesthood. And I have found, in these 51 years, parishioners who offered prayers, love, and support, and have made my priesthood richly rewarding. To my parish family here at St. Peter, I thank you for inviting me to serve Christ in my service to you. I also thank you for overlooking my many flaws, and weaknesses, and forgiving me for these areas of much needed improvement. I also praise God for parishioners and priests who have contributed to my vocation, especially people like Fr. Roy Bauer, who saw in me a vocation that I didn't always see in my life. And I especially thank my parents and grandparents who provided the example and support to carry me through these 51 years.

I also want to congratulate Mrs. Lori Bertram who just recently won the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton award offered by the diocese to a teacher who has made a major impact upon her students and peers. Bishop Paprocki was present several weeks ago to present this diocesan award to Lori. This is quite an honor for her and our school and parish. And so we congratulate Lori as she received this honor given to a teacher of the diocese for outstanding ministry and teaching. Her award only goes to show that we have an outstanding faculty and the religious teaching and formation given to our young people is also outstanding. I want to thank all of our teachers for their efforts to assist with the evangelization of our students.

Still continuing to pack things up. I find this to be quite a chore. Construction progress: The bricklayers started constructing their scaffolding required to start laying bricks. Mechanical rough-in has continued as well as the mudding and taping of dry wall. Next week the food service contractor will be onsite to install the cooler. The elevator contractor was onsite this week to coordinate with electrical and get mobilized for installation. Things seem to be coming together. I know that there seems to be a change in the placement of some classrooms. Seton Hall, originally our junior high, will become our pre-school area, which will make it much more accessible for pickup and delivery.


