Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

JUNE 14, 2026

Exodus 19:2-6a; Romans 5:6-11;
Matthew 9:36-10:8

The season of “Ordinary Time” might well be called the “Season of the Church.” It tells us who we are and what we should do as “Church.” It challenges us to live up to our call from God.

The setting of today’s first reading is the enactment of the Covenant between God and his people at the foot of Mt. Sinai. Who are God’s people? They are a motley group of escaped slaves from Egypt. But God calls them to be something more: They are called to be his “special possession, dearer than all the peoples of the earth a kingdom of priests, a holy nation!” Quite a calling for a group of escaped slaves!

Who are God’s people? The second reading is from the greatest of Paul’s epistles, his letter to the Romans. In it, Paul shows that everyone in the world is a sinner; no one is worthy of the glory of God.

But in his unfathomable mercy, when we were enemies of God, he sent his Son to save us! If he did this when we were his enemies, how much more does he love us now that we have been redeemed by Jesus Christ! Who are we? We are sinners – but beloved and redeemed by God through Jesus!

The Gospel tells of the call of the disciples. Jesus laments that there is a great harvest but few workers. The apostles were not very intelligent; nor were they talented. But Christ called them to be his witnesses.

He also calls us to be his fellow workers in service. Who are we? We may have few gifts of nature, but Christ calls us to proclaim his good news.

So, what are *you* doing to live up to your high calling? Do you realize the dignity of your call? Are you a person of hope and of joy who radiates good news?

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 14, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

Well, after two Solemnities, the Church has resumed to “ordinary time” with our weekend celebrations. Again, it is called “ordinary” because there is no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ being celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ in itself is honored in its fullness. And so today, we celebrate the 11th Sunday in this time called “ordinary”

Our gospel for this Sunday has Jesus dealing with His statement, that “The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few.” He looked around at the sight of the crowd gathered and His heart was moved with pity for them because “they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd.” And so, Jesus undertakes His choosing of the twelve apostles who would become the laborers for the harvest. When we look at these apostles, we might wonder and question His choices. We find men like Peter, who would deny knowing Jesus; we find men like Judas, who would betray Him; and we find men like Thomas, who would doubt Him. Why would Jesus choose such men to labor in the harvest? We will never know the answer to that question. We might speculate that He takes each of us where we are and gives us His grace to assist us in any vocation for which He calls us. Such is the case of the apostles, and such is the case of each of us. God doesn’t expect perfection, but He does expect us to be open to His graces. And in their simplicity and humility, these apostles tried to fulfill that role. Thus, Jesus sent them out instructing them, “go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel, and “make this proclamation, the Kingdom of heaven is at hand.” I wonder to myself what these men thought with these instructions. Did they feel competent? Only with the grace of God.

If you check your July newsletter, there will be an introduction to our new pastor, Fr. Dan Bergbower. We welcome him to our parish and ask God to fill him with the same graces He gave to the apostles as He sent them forth to a new mission. From personal experience, I know that He is coming to a great parish family and will enjoy sharing His vocation with all of us.

Since I will be absent from the parish for the next two weekends, visiting my family in Pennsylvania, I want to welcome Fr. Jeff Grant to our parish as my substitute. Fr. Jeff is also one of those of us called, “pastor emeritus” and he seems to be enjoying his new role. Welcome Fr. Jeff.

Construction update: The brick started to go up this week. Over the next couple of weeks, the outside of the building will change drastically. Inside we hung a significant portion of the grid for the ceilings upstairs. This allows lighting fixtures and sprinkler heads to be dropped and work has started on that. Other rough in and drywall work continued. Flooring is set to begin next month. Please keep your pledges coming as our project continues.

Fr. Paul and I continue our packing. This is always a chore for me as I seem sometimes to be a packrat. I always think I will use this or that item in the future but the sad part is that I couldn’t possibly locate the item if I needed it for the present. Once again I am thankful for the members of the QND football team, coaches, and the men of this parish for helping me move into my new place.
