Jeremiah 20:10-13; Romans 5:12-15;
Matthew 10:26-33

Quite often, we would like to keep quiet. After all, who wants to make waves except a rabble-rouser or a fanatic? Jeremiah (first reading) would have preferred to keep quiet. God had told him to announce the doom of his nation because of its corruption. Because of his message, people hated him and wanted him dead.

The second reading tells us that we suffer the effects of original sin. We don't always see (or want to see) the pure truth of a matter. We are always tempted to take the easy way out, the line of least resistance. We are tempted to rationalize. It is easy to settle for mediocrity. But Christ has redeemed us! Original sin is no excuse for mediocrity, for Christ's redemption is more powerful than original sin's effects.

In the Gospel, the Lord tells us not to be intimidated by this world. Why should we be afraid to proclaim the truth? If people stood up to tyrants, there could be no tyranny. If we stood together against evil, there could be no evil!

Remember the old saying of Edmond Burke: "The only thing necessary for evil to triumph is that the good do nothing!" Jesus calls you to stand for him, to witness for him.

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 21, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

As you know, our pastor, Monsignor Leo Enlow, is away this week visiting his family in Pennsylvania. Please keep Monsignor Enlow in your prayers for a refreshing visit, filled with rest, joy and a safe return to us. While he is away, I am grateful for the opportunity to shepherd you during this time and to share this weekly bulletin with you.

Last Sunday the Gospel placed before us the Image of the Heart of Jesus. A Heart of compassion, mercy and love. Jesus looks upon the crowd; His heart was moved with pity for them because “they were troubled and abandoned like sheep without a shepherd.” Then, Jesus calls and send the twelve disciples into the harvest saying: The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few.” He gave them authority over unclean spirit and power to heal. So, today we celebrate 12th Sunday in Ordinary time year A. In our Gospel for this Sunday, Jesus repeatedly tells his disciples, do not be afraid. He repeats this message several times because He knows they face rejection and opposition. That is why Jesus keeps saying, “do not be afraid.” Fear is one of the common human experiences. We fear illness, failures, loneliness, old age and death. In our times, many people live with anxiety because of wars, economic difficulties, social tension and personal struggles. Jesus doesn’t ignore these realities. He doesn’t pretend that suffering does not exist. Instead, He speaks directly into our fears and says, “Do not be afraid.” His words are not simply an encouragement to be brave but an invitation to trust in God. Jesus reassures his disciples that they truly have nothing to fear. Jesus reminded them that people may harm the body but cannot destroy the soul, only God holds the ultimate power over our lives. Then Jesus concludes with a beautiful image. He speaks of a sparrow, a tiny bird that seems unimportant, yet not one of them falls without God knowing and caring for them. If God cares for such a small creature, how much more does God care for us? We are all God’s children. He cares for us, before we speak. He knows our needs, before we call upon him, He already looks upon us with love and care. Today, may we hear again the voice of Jesus echoing through the Gospel. “Do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows.”

Work began on framing the skywalk, and the flooring company started grinding to prep the floors for the epoxy pour. Other interior work continued, including painting, ceilings, and fixtures. Please keep your pledges coming as our project continues.

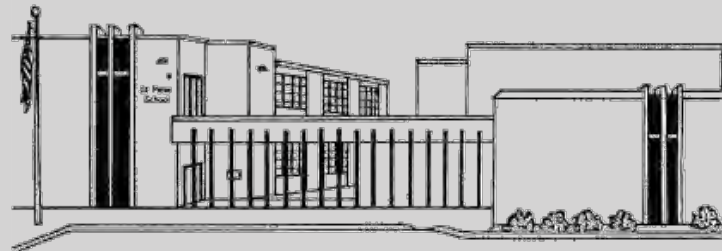

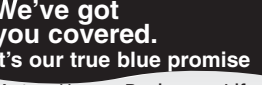
