Body and Blood of Christ

JUNE 7, 2026

Deuteronomy 8:2-3,14b-16a;
1 Corinthians 10:16-17; John 6:51-58

Today's feast is usually known by its Latin title "Corpus Christi." We firmly believe that, at the consecration of Mass, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of the risen Lord Jesus Christ. In Communion, then, we do not receive bread and wine; we receive the glorified Christ under the appearances of bread and wine. After the consecration, nothing of the bread or wine remains except the "accidental appearances" such as taste, size, texture, etc. The reality is the risen Lord!

But we can receive the Body and Blood of Christ every day without any benefit unless we give ourselves to Christ. We must live by his word if his sacrament is to be of any benefit to us. This is the message of today's Mass.

The first reading tells of Moses' last instructions to the Israelites. He reminds them that they were all fed by manna, a miraculous food. But the manna did not save them unless they lived by the word of the Lord. Through the centuries, rabbis began to speak of the "bread of life" as the "Torah" or God's holy word. Whoever "ate the bread" of the Torah would live forever.

In the gospel, Jesus says that he, not the Torah, is the bread of life. He replaces the Torah; we must live by his word. Then, astoundingly, he states that the new manna that he will give will be his flesh! The Eucharist, then, is the sign that we give ourselves totally and completely to keep the word of Christ. Whoever lives according to his word will richly profit from the Eucharist.

The second reading reminds us of the social implications of the Eucharist. If you and you and you and I are united with the same Eucharistic Lord, then we must be united with each other. We, though many, become one Body of Christ. Therefore we must carry each other's burdens and share each other's sorrows.

CORPUS CHRISTI

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we are invited to remember how faithfully God provides for His people.

In our first reading from Deuteronomy, Moses recalls how the Lord fed the Israelites with manna in the desert, teaching them that “not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of the Lord.” The manna sustained Israel on their journey to the Promised Land, but it was also a sign pointing to an even greater gift yet to come. God never abandons His people. He nourishes us not only physically, but spiritually, providing exactly what we need to persevere through the deserts and challenges of life.

In the Gospel, Jesus reveals the fulfillment of that promise when He declares, “I am the living bread that came down from heaven.” These words leave no room for misunderstanding. Christ offers us His very Flesh and Blood as true food and true drink. In the Eucharist, we do not merely remember Jesus, we receive Him.

Every Mass is an encounter with the living Lord who gives Himself completely for our salvation. As Catholics, we are blessed with this extraordinary gift that strengthens us for our pilgrimage toward heaven. May this feast deepen our reverence for the Blessed Sacrament, renew our gratitude for the gift of the Mass, and inspire us to become what we receive in the Body of Christ present in the world through lives of faith, charity, and self-giving love.

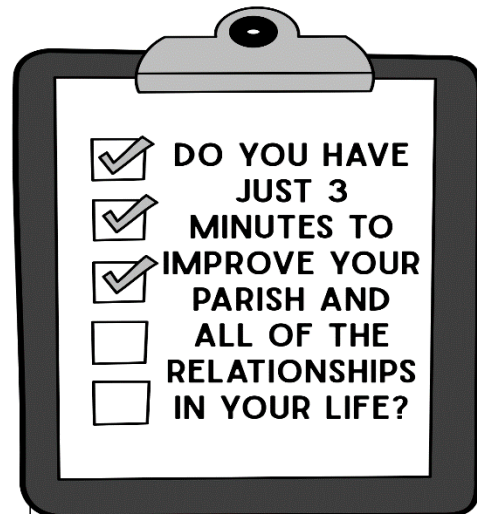
