Body and Blood of Christ

JUNE 7, 2026

Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a;
1 Corinthians 10:16-17; John 6:51-58

Today's feast is usually known by its Latin title "Corpus Christi." We firmly believe that, at the consecration of Mass, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of the risen Lord Jesus Christ. In Communion, then, we do not receive bread and wine; we receive the glorified Christ under the appearances of bread and wine. After the consecration, nothing of the bread or wine remains except the "accidental appearances" such as taste, size, texture, etc. The reality is the risen Lord!

But we can receive the Body and Blood of Christ every day without any benefit unless we give ourselves to Christ. We must live by his word if his sacrament is to be of any benefit to us. This is the message of today's Mass.

The first reading tells of Moses' last instructions to the Israelites. He reminds them that they were all fed by manna, a miraculous food. But the manna did not save them unless they lived by the word of the Lord. Through the centuries, rabbis began to speak of the "bread of life" as the "Torah" or God's holy word. Whoever "ate the bread" of the Torah would live forever.

In the gospel, Jesus says that he, not the Torah, is the bread of life. He replaces the Torah; we must live by his word. Then, astoundingly, he states that the new manna that he will give will be his flesh! The Eucharist, then, is the sign that we give ourselves totally and completely to keep the word of Christ. Whoever lives according to his word will richly profit from the Eucharist.

The second reading reminds us of the social implications of the Eucharist. If you and you and you and I are united with the same Eucharistic Lord, then we must be united with each other. We, though many, become one Body of Christ. Therefore we must carry each other's burdens and share each other's sorrows.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Solemnity, June 7, 2026

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, translated from the Latin as the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This Solemnity celebrates who we are as Catholics and this most important sacrament that makes Christ present on our altar every day. If we look around our St. Peter Church, we will take notice of the many symbols of the Eucharist that appear especially in the glassed windows of our Church. On the left side, in the windows above, are the fish and loaves, the grapes and wheat, and the Sacrifice of the Cross. On the opposite side, in the windows up high, are the vine and grapes, the wine and bread, and the Monstrance, exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Then throughout the Church in what is called the Nave of the Church, you will find symbols of a chalice and host (Eucharist), and also an image of a Pelican. In this symbol we see a mother pelican plucking open her breast to feed her young with her own blood. She dies that they may live. In a like manner Christ died upon the Cross that we may live. So, our celebration today of this Solemnity is captured through many differing images and symbols seen throughout our Church.

In our gospel for this weekend, Jesus spells out what our Eucharist means to us. He tells us, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." This was and is a difficult saying to grasp. We even hear how the Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us His flesh to eat?" Then Jesus states boldly, "Amen, Amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day." I am sure that Jesus lost several of His disciples because of His words to them in this gospel. But Jesus let them leave because His words are the very words that we believe about our Sacrament of the Eucharist. When we come forward and respond Amen when we hear the "Body of Christ," or the "Blood of Christ," we are stating that we believe in the words of Jesus. And it is these words which will provide eternal life for us as they proclaim the REAL PRESENCE OF CHRIST IN THE EUCHARIST. To celebrate this Solemnity, we will have a Eucharistic Procession around Madison Park after the 11:00 a.m. Mass and conclude back in Church with Benediction. Fr. Paul will be leading us in this procession.
