Wisdom 12:13,16-19; Romans 8:26-27;
 Matthew 13:24-43

At times, we are tempted to want God to destroy our enemies. Like the apostles, we want to call down fire from heaven to consume the evil doers. But that is not God's way!

No other religion in the world preaches compassion and mercy and forgiveness for the evil doer as does genuine Christianity. Among others, justice and retribution are swift and decisive.

Our God is not like that. He shows his power most perfectly in his mercy! He forgives the unforgivable in order to draw all people to himself. Our first reading, from Wisdom, describes this loving kindness.

The Gospel is the parable of the wheat and the weeds. The word for "weeds" in the original language is for a specific weed, called darnel. Darnel looked very much like wheat in its early growth; it even headed out like wheat, but it was poison.

If we wanted to make an allegory out of the parable, we could say that often a religious spirit can be "faked." Evil often masquerades as good, so we must be cautious.

But a deeper message is that God permits evil to exist with a hope for the conversion of the evil doer. The existence of evil in the world should challenge the Christian to a stronger faith – and to greater mercy in order to be like God.

The second reading should give us confidence: The Holy Spirit is within us. Through him, we are empowered to withstand evil and to be strong in the face of weakness.

16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

This Sunday's readings remind us of something that is both comforting and challenging: God is patient. In the Book of Wisdom, we hear that God's power is shown not through harshness, but through mercy. The Lord, who could judge instantly, instead gives people time to repent, to grow, and to return to Him. In a world that often demands immediate results and quick judgments, God reveals a different way. His justice is always tempered by love, and His strength is made perfect in mercy. That same patience is extended to each one of us every day, inviting us to become more faithful disciples.

Jesus continues this lesson in the Gospel with the parable of the wheat and the weeds. We may wonder why God allows evil to exist or why those who do wrong seem to flourish. Yet Jesus reminds us that the final judgment belongs to God alone. Until that day, the wheat and the weeds grow together. This is not because God is indifferent to evil, but because He is patient, always desiring the conversion of the sinner. We should be cautious about judging the hearts of others, remembering that God may still be at work in ways we cannot see. At the same time, we are called to examine our own hearts, allowing the Lord to remove whatever keeps us from bearing good fruit.

As members of the parish family of St. Francis Solanus, let us ask the Lord for the grace to reflect His patience and mercy in our homes, our workplaces, and our community. Rather than becoming discouraged by the brokenness we see around us, may we become faithful witnesses to the goodness of Christ. Every act of kindness, every prayer offered for another, every quiet decision to forgive, and every effort to live the Gospel helps the Kingdom of God take deeper root. Trust that the Divine Gardener knows exactly what He is doing. If we remain rooted in Christ, He will bring forth a harvest far greater than we could ever imagine.

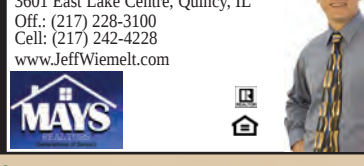
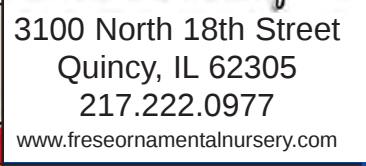
