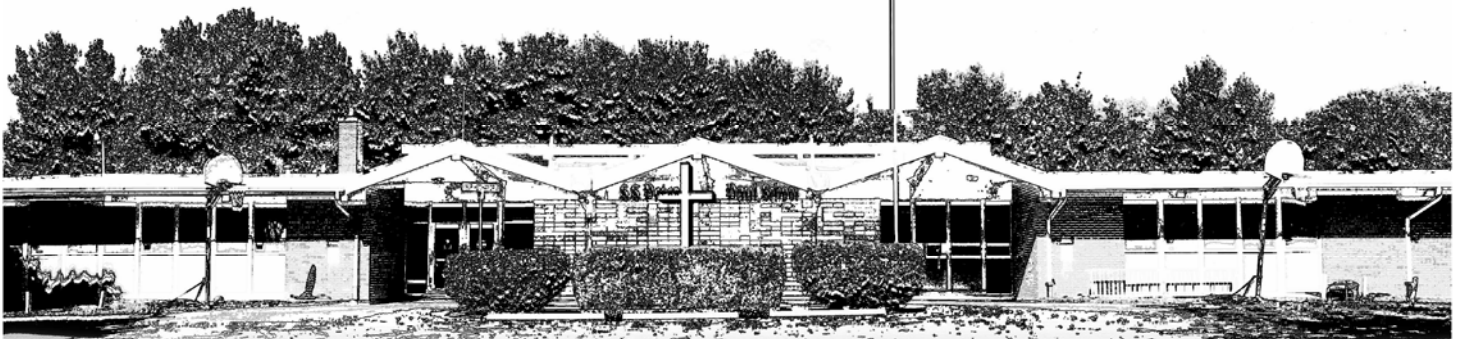

The United States of America; The Catholic Church: *Persons?*

Over many years of pastoral counselling, I've witnessed two things that stun me, every time they happen right in front of me. In one, an individual who has reformed his life sheepishly asks whether his former life had been the reason for the problems of another individual. The response is "yes," and the reformed individual is devastated, absolutely crushed. A golden rule? Such a moment of honesty is ok - *as long as the dredging up of the past doesn't make things worse, for all the attempts at being honest.* Here's another one: an individual is deeply wounded by another who is dearly loved. The anger, venom, and resentment are overwhelming. And yet, if somebody else expresses the same anger, venom and resentment as the hurt individual did....the hurt individual fiercely defends the very person who inflicted the hurt! Another golden rule? *Somebody falling short in your life doesn't automatically mean that you stop loving them.* You get defensive about people who have angered and hurt you, because your love gives you insight into the good that's there. And that good is worth fighting for.

Our nation is a "corporate person": do you realize that that's a formal legal designation? And I've witnessed two things in the present day, when it comes to this corporate person. In one, the sins of our former periods of history - long past and on the road of healing and reconciliation - are rubbed in our face as if we are still stuck in those former historical periods. That's a shattering experience, to have our past held against us, to the point of tearing our corporate person down, instead of learning from the past and coming out better for the hard learning. The other? That's when others express the same ache and agony as we do, but the love holding up and fighting for what is best about us, while working through the ache and the agony, doesn't seem to be there in force. In either case, that's no way to treat persons, individual or corporate.

Try to make use of these examples to test the citizenry of our nation this 4th of July.
