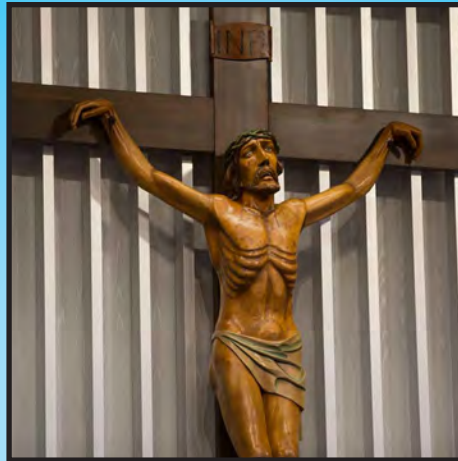

July 5, 2026—Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (A)

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

A few weeks ago, the United States Bishops met, and as part of their work together, they celebrated Mass to re-dedicate the United States of America to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The prayer of consecration, printed below, is one that seems most fitting for this, the weekend of the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

O Most Sacred Heart of Jesus:

*You know the longings of our hearts,
and you desire that we enjoy friendship
with you.*

*From your pierced side, you have
poured out the wellspring of life, for
which we thirst.*

*Your heart burns with a love for all
people to return to a right relationship
with you.*

*We celebrate the abundant gifts you
have given this nation, founded on the
self-evident truths that our Creator has
endowed all people with the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.*

*We make reparation for the offenses against you and against human dignity
that have taken place in this nation.*

*May our hearts be united to yours, so that our families and communities enjoy
peace and happiness; may broken relationships be reconciled, injustices
repaired, and the wounds of our land be healed.*

*May your holy Catholic Church serve as a sign, pointing all people to your
infinite love.*

*O Desire of Nations and Center of History, we ask you to bless these United
States of America.*

*Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for
ever and ever. Amen.*

This weekend bears the title of Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, and so the liturgy does not call for a specific observance of the Fourth of July civil holiday, but it is good for men and women of patriotic integrity and Christian virtue to take a few moments to give thanks for the blessings which have been bestowed on our nation, and to re-dedicate ourselves to the ideals on which we as a nation were founded. The Declaration of Independence reasons that a people may rightly seek political independence when the God-given rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness are denied. These rights are not concessions from the State; they arise from the Creator, who endows each person with an inalienable dignity.

Yet we are not created for life without limit, liberty without moral order, or happiness reduced to appetite. Nor is every person guaranteed success in these pursuits. Rather, we are entrusted with a great freedom to seek the good, to build a just society, and to order our lives toward the truth. Indeed, we have a solemn responsibility to defend this way of life through civic duty at the ballot box, in the jury room, in free public speech, and, when necessary, on the battlefield. America's promise is not an idolatrous kind of self-worship, but ordered to thanksgiving: a free people, under God, using liberty not to escape him, but to return to Him who is our greatest happiness.

Mass Intentions for 2027: On Monday, July 6 we will 'open our books' for Mass intentions in 2026. These 'intentions' are for the deceased who are often mentioned during Mass, "for whom this Mass is offered". It is customary to make an offering of \$10 for a Mass intention. While we do our best to accommodate date requests for specific intentions, we cannot guarantee or reserve particular dates. If there is a request for specific dates, we take them on a 'first-come first-served' basis. We do ask that when multiple intentions are being scheduled that they be divided somewhat evenly between weekend and weekday dates. Finally, we do ask that for major Holy Days (Christmas, Easter) that a particular intention or family only appear once every third year, in order to make these dates accessible to others who might want to choose that date. When we schedule an intention, it is with the understanding that our schedule can and does change on occasion, and when a date cannot be honored (because Mass is not being celebrated or it is being re-scheduled), we will do our best to accommodate other dates and choices... please be patient and cooperative with our parish staff when that need arises. Each Sunday and Holy Day a "Mass for the People", for all the living and deceased of the parish is celebrated, which calls to mind all of the faithful in the parish. 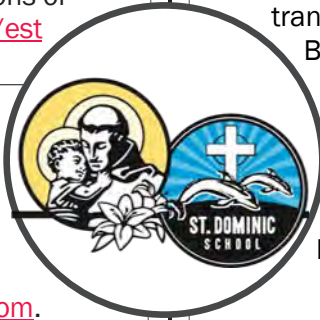
