Isaiah 55:1-3; Romans 8:35,37-39;
Matthew 14:13-21

America is the most over-fed and undernourished nation in the world. We are an obese nation of junk food junkies. For us, thirst is to be deprived of a Coke or Pepsi, and hunger is to be without a Big Mac or a pizza.

Suppose we were really hungry. Suppose we had to spend all of our waking hours working for just a morsel of food. The people of the Bible knew real hunger and privation. This is why they thought of paradise as a great feast.

Today's first reading was written near the end of the Babylonian Captivity (c. 538 B.C.) The people longed for release; they longed for food which would satisfy; they thought that when the Messiah came, he would provide an everlasting feast free of charge.

Jesus is truly the Messiah. Yet, when he came, he did not make everything perfect. The great feast will come, but only in heaven. Meanwhile, Jesus gave a sign of what was to come by feeding 5,000 people with a few loaves and fish.

The liturgy today would have us go beyond mere physical hunger: What are we *really* hungry for? We seem to have insatiable appetites; what are we *really* seeking in life?

The Lord has made us for himself alone. No pleasure of this life can completely satisfy us. Jesus said, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness; they will be filled."

Our second reading contains the most consoling verses in the Bible: Nothing can ever separate us from the love of God! No crisis or tragedy can ever keep God's love from us. If you are ever depressed or discouraged, read the eighth chapter of Romans! Have hope! To be Christian is to be a person of hope and joy, for nothing can separate you from God's love.

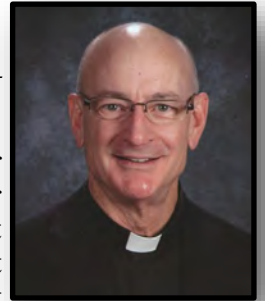

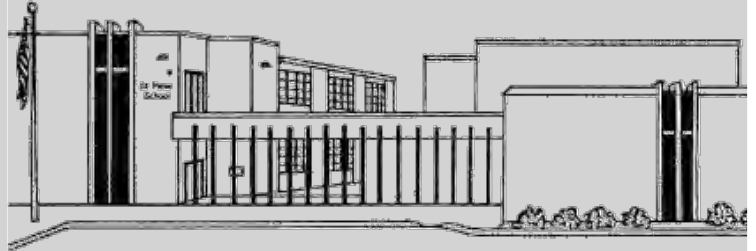
SOUND SYSTEM UPDATE This past week a group of parishioners met with our friends from Music Makers who installed our current system. We addressed three areas. The first was that of volume. They have all been readjusted and reset and we have been reeducated on the correct usage. This has been most helpful. The second area is that of the "bouncing" of sound due to the interior of the church, namely the hard surfaces. Although the sound is louder it is not necessarily understandable. We are looking into options to "dampen" the echo chamber effect. Lastly, we began the discussion about those who have hearing aids. I, Fr. Dan, have hearing aides and I know of these challenges personally. We are in the research phase right now. Noted are blue tooth options and the copper wire option which St. Francis has. We will continue to update as we investigate these options.

May God's most Holy Spirit continue to lead us and guide us!

Mission Appeal for the Diocese of Abakaliki

The Catholic Diocese of Abakaliki in Nigeria is passing through a season of deep sorrow following the passing of Bishop Peter. As the clergy, religious, and faithful mourn their shepherd, they continue to bear the responsibility of serving some of the poorest and most vulnerable communities in rural areas of the Diocese. Today, we invite you to stand with them in faith, compassion, and solidarity.

The Diocese is a lifeline for widows, orphans, the elderly, the homeless, and the socially displaced people who, in a functioning society, should be cared for by established government institutions. Violence, insecurity, and economic hardship have left many families shattered. Each year, more than 2,000 widows and orphans turn to the Diocese seeking food, clothing, medical care, and emotional support. Many children long for the opportunity to continue their education, and over 30 are currently sponsored in higher institutions—yet countless more wait with hope.

Beyond emergency relief, the Diocese shelters the mentally ill, the disabled, and those with nowhere else to turn. In this moment of grief, your generosity becomes a healing balm. It becomes food for the hungry, comfort for widows, education for orphans, dignity for the forgotten, and strength for future priests and nuns who will carry the mission forward.

We humbly ask you to join us in this mission work. May your kindness bring hope where it is fading, and may God bless you abundantly for your compassion.
