Isaiah 56:1,6-7; Romans 11:13-15,29-32;
 Matthew 15:21-28

The readings of today's Mass should stir us to concern for the salvation of our neighborhood, our community, and our world. God chose a people through whom he would reveal himself to the world. The Hebrew people are his first choice. He gave them his Holy Torah or Law; he sent them prophets; he called them to be a priestly nation, a royal people. Unfortunately, they often became smug and self-satisfied; they thought that the rest of the world was damned, and that they were the only righteous people in the world.

The last part of the book of Isaiah (chapters 56-66) gives a different outlook. God reminds the Hebrews that he calls all people to salvation. He intends all peoples to come and worship him, the one true God. Today's first reading is taken from this section.

In the second reading (from Romans) Paul laments the fact that his people, the Jews, have not recognized Jesus as Messiah. But he says that this is for a purpose: in order that God may show mercy to the Gentiles (the pagans, the non-Jews, that is to us!).

The Gospel tells the story of a pagan woman who asks Jesus to cure her daughter. Jesus ignores her. He says that his mission is only to save Israel. He tells her that it is not right to take children's food and give it to dogs. (Jews called Gentiles "dogs.") She matches wits with Jesus and says, "Yes, but even the dogs get the scraps which the children sneak to them under the table."

Jesus has not really been as brutal as our translation makes it seem. The Greek word used for "dog" here really means something like "puppy" or "house pets." It is an affectionate term. In doing this, the woman is given an opportunity for faith; and she expresses it!

Putting all the readings together, we see that we must have a concern for our neighbor's salvation. We would surely take food to our neighbor if he is hungry. We must provide the bread of truth for our neighbor who is starving for the Lord.

The Responsorial Psalm sums up the message: "O God, let all the nations praise you!" But the nations cannot praise God unless you and I reach out to bring them to faith!

20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The prophet Isaiah reminds us that God's house is meant to be "a house of prayer for all peoples." The Lord's love is not limited by nationality, background, or circumstance. What matters is the heart that seeks Him and the life that strives to walk in His ways. This is a beautiful reminder for us as a parish community. The Church is not a private club for those who have everything figured out; it is the household of God, where every person is invited to encounter His mercy, truth, and love. As disciples of Christ, we are called not only to welcome others through the doors of our churches, but also to make sure that our words and actions communicate that welcome. Then to pray and guide each other to that encounter with the Lord in that radical hospitality.

The Gospel gives us a challenging example of this truth in the Canaanite woman who approaches Jesus on behalf of her suffering daughter. She is an outsider, yet she refuses to give up. Her persistent faith eventually draws from Jesus the affirmation, "O woman, great is your faith!" Her story reminds us that God can find profound faith in places and people we might least expect. It also challenges us to examine whether there are people whom we have quietly placed outside the boundaries of God's mercy. May we have the humility of the Canaanite woman to trust in the Lord and the generosity of Jesus to recognize and welcome faith wherever we find it. As a parish family, may St. Francis Solanus always be a place where every person can discover that there is room for them at the table of God's mercy.

At the end of June Doris Karhoff was given the Woman of Distinction Award by Bishop Thomas John Paprocki at the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women event at the Cathedral. Doris is truly deserving of this award as she is always serving.
