Isaiah 22:19-23; Romans 11:33-36;

Matthew 16:13-20

Catholics believe that the lawfully elected Bishop of Rome is the successor of Peter and visible head of the Church. If we have the same Church which Jesus established, we must have the office of Peter. What is this office?

It is described in today's Gospel. After Simon Bar-Jona professes that Jesus is Messiah, Jesus tells him that he did not come to this on his own ability, but that God had revealed it to him.

Jesus then changes his name from Simon to Peter (which means "Rock.") He gives him the keys of the kingdom of heaven. "Kingdom of heaven" is the Church. He tells him that whatever he binds on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever he looses will be loosed.

"Binding and loosing" was a rabbinical expression for the authority to impose or to release from legal obligations. The meaning of the "keys" is found in the first reading: The "master of the palace" had complete authority over the king's household, second only to the king. He wore a key on a sash over his shoulder as a sign of his authority. To have the "keys of the kingdom of heaven," therefore, means to have authority second to that of Jesus Christ.

Peter is always first in the Gospel lists of apostles. Peter is the spokesman of the Church in Acts of Apostles. The Church acknowledged him as leader. It is historically certain that Peter went to Rome and was martyred there in the arena of Nero on Vatican Hill. His grave is under the high altar of St. Peter's Basilica.

The Church has always recognized, then, that the successor of Peter is the lawful bishop of Rome. The Pope does not tell us everything to do or not to do. But he is the center of Church unity. We cannot have the Church of Jesus Christ without him.

21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

We see the establishment of the role of the steward of the household and papacy in the readings this weekend. God entrusts great responsibility to those whom He calls.

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah speaks of Eliakim, who is given authority over the house of David. He receives the “key” as a sign of responsibility to open and to close, to care for God’s people and to exercise his authority faithfully. In the Gospel, Jesus uses this same imagery when He gives Peter the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven. Peter is not chosen because he is perfect or because he will never make mistakes. He is chosen because God sees in him the faith and willingness through which He can build His Church. We see the keys don’t make someone king, but steward. We see that it is an office to be handed down.

At the heart of the Gospel is a question that Jesus continues to ask every one of us: “Who do you say that I am?” It is not enough to know what other people say about Jesus. Our faith must become personal. Peter answers, “You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.” That confession of faith is the foundation of discipleship. Each of us has been entrusted with a particular responsibility in the Church and in the world. We may sometimes feel inadequate, as Peter surely did, but God does not call the perfect; He calls ordinary people and gives them the grace to do extraordinary things. May we have the courage to profess our faith in Jesus Christ and, like Peter, allow Him to use our lives as instruments for building His Church.

School is in full swing! How exciting to have all the kids back at St. Francis, at QND, and at QU. Tons of energy and excitement all around us. Please always be welcoming and hospitable to our QU students and any visitor. Pray for a successful year.

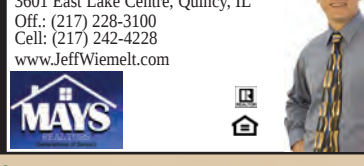
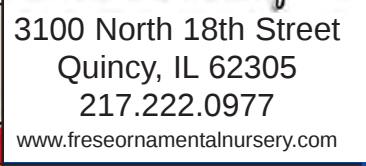
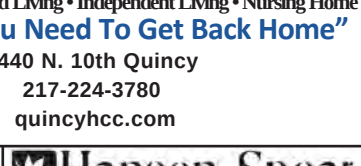
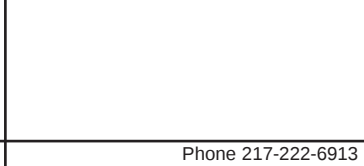
Hours: Up to seven hours a day when school is in session and lunch is served. Maximum 35 hours per week. Up to 100 hours in the summer.
