1 Kings 19:9a,11-13a; Romans 9:1-5;
 Matthew 14:22-33

If we have faith, God will see that we overcome any obstacle. The setting of today's first reading is Elijah's dejection. After he had defeated the prophets of Baal, Queen Jezebel set out to kill him.

Discouraged and depressed, Elijah escapes to the Sinai desert. No one is faithful to God any more, and he wants to die. God sets him down and shows him powerful signs.

But God is not in these powerful displays. Finally, in a gentle breeze, Elijah encounters God. The message: Don't look for spectacles; you will find God in the peace of your soul; from there he will triumph over all difficulties.

The background of the Gospel is actually the setting of the Church of around 80 A.D. Christians had been expelled from the Synagogue. They were now outlaws to the Romans. They were persecuted and killed.

The Church is seen as a boat being tossed about in a storm. Jesus comes walking on the water. The disciples can't believe it is he. As a test, Peter is invited to walk on the water. He loses faith and begins to sink.

Jesus saves him and says that if he had faith he could do what Jesus did. Jesus gets into the boat and calms the storm. The lesson: the Church can weather any storm if we only have faith.

In the second reading, Paul is in agony because his fellow Jews do not accept Jesus. He, too, must learn to trust and to have faith that God's will will be accomplished.

19TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today, we encounter a God who often speaks in ways we least expect. Elijah goes searching for the Lord on the mountain, but God is not found in the powerful wind, the earthquake, or the fire. Instead, the Lord comes in the tiny whispering sound, the gentle stillness that requires a listening heart. In our busy and noisy world, we can easily mistake activity for holiness and volume for truth. Yet the Lord continues to invite us into moments of quiet prayer where He can calm our hearts and remind us that He is always near. We don't have to climb a mountain to encounter God, but we do need to make room for silence amid the distractions that constantly compete for our attention.

The Gospel continues this invitation to trust. As the disciples struggle against the wind and waves, Jesus comes to them across the water, urging them not to be afraid. Peter's bold step out of the boat is a beautiful reminder that faith often requires us to leave the comfort of what is familiar. Like Peter, we all experience moments when fear begins to outweigh trust, and we start to sink beneath the weight of life's challenges. Yet the Lord never stands at a distance. He immediately reaches out His hand, lifts us up, and invites us to fix our eyes on Him once again. Whether we are facing uncertainty in our families, our health, our work, or our parish, Christ remains present. If we keep our gaze on Him, we will discover that His grace is always greater than the storms we face.

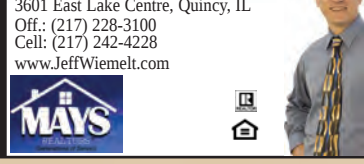
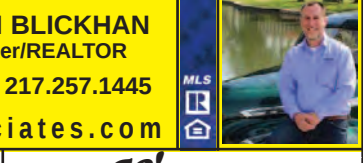
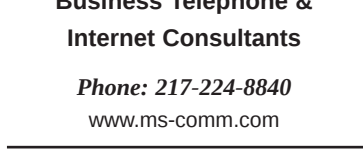
