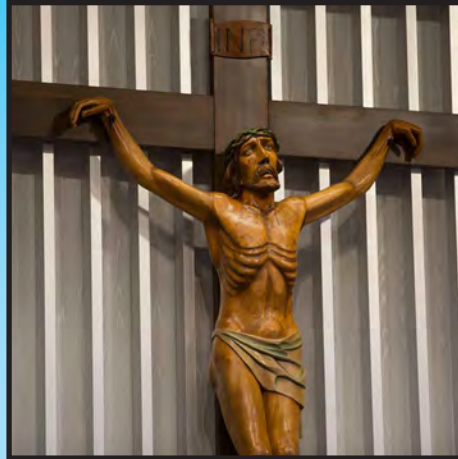

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



"Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was, he became frightened." How can we describe Peter? At once both faithful and fearful, his jumbled responses remind us that he was no spiritual superman, well-intentioned though he may have been. Peter wanted to believe, and in fact showed a great deal of confidence in Christ. But his temptation to doubt was strong enough to knock him off his feet, literally.

"O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" Jesus reprimanded Peter. The words seem harsh. After

all, out of all the disciples, Peter was the only one who had enough faith to even try something as ludicrous as stepping out of the boat onto the water in the first place. But perhaps Jesus wanted to emphasize that our faith needs to be strong enough to weather the storm, so to speak.

If we only believe in Jesus when the wind is calm and the waves are gone, is that truly having faith in him? Is that actually trusting in his supreme power over the forces of the universe? Peter sank as soon as a challenge appeared. Jesus called him to stay on his feet as the winds begin to blow. So, what are the winds that threaten our faith? What kinds of gusts are blowing today? Whatever it might be, none of it is too much for Jesus to handle. But we must step out in faith and trust him! And we need to keep our eyes on him as we do so, instead of getting distracted by the force of the challenges we face. We have nothing to fear as long as we are walking towards him.

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary falls on Saturday, August 15. Because the Solemnity falls on Saturday, this year it is **not** a holyday of obligation. Mass will be offered on the Vigil, Friday evening, August 14 at 4:00 p.m. in honor of the Assumption. The two Masses regularly scheduled on Saturday evening must observe the 20th Sunday of Ordinary Time. The Assumption is a special privilege belonging to the Mother of God, who born without the stain of sin, avoids the ignominy of the grave. In Mary, humanity returns to its preternatural state before the sin of our first parents, prefiguring the glory we all await in the Resurrection of the Dead. And so, what this solemnity calls to mind is that the same glory shared by Mary is promised to the Church. Thus, this feast is not only an opportunity to venerate Mary as the first of the Saints of Heaven, but it is also an opportunity to recommit ourselves to Christian Virtue which perfects the gifts of God within us and prepares us to share in the eternal glory of his Kingdom.

The Church sings of Mary, *tota pulchra est: macula non est in te*, "You are all-beautiful, there is no stain of sin within you!" which is taken from the Song of Songs, 4:7, praising the beauty of Israel, forgiven of her sins and drawn into intimacy of Divine Love.



Next weekend: Note the extra Mass at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday. This is our "Welcome Back to School" Mass at St. Dominic School, to include the blessing of student backpacks. All are welcome. School starts on Tuesday, August 18. Wednesday Mass will return to 8:30 a.m. at St. Dominic School starting August 19.

Our students will experience traveling to a different country each month by using Google Earth to see and visit holy places in the world from above with high-resolution satellite imagery. Each month, we will learn about a different country's culture and how the people there live their Catholic faith. We will also learn about one of the Church's beautiful devotions each month. As we travel the world together, students will collect each country's stamp for their own passport. As we study the monthly Catholic devotions, we will enhance our prayer life. A pilgrimage reminds us of our journey toward eternal life in heaven. Every day, we will ask God to give us everything we need and to make us more like His beloved son, Jesus Christ, and our most holy mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. Please pray for our 2026-2027 St. Dominic School pilgrimage.

Back To School Mass for Families: On Sunday, August 16 at 4:00 p.m., Sunday Mass will be held in the Gym. After Mass we will have the Blessing of the Backpacks. Students may bring school supplies.
