Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

AUGUST 9, 2026

1 Kings 19:9a,11-13a; Romans 9:1-5;
Matthew 14:22-33

If we have faith, God will see that we overcome any obstacle. The setting of today's first reading is Elijah's dejection. After he had defeated the prophets of Baal, Queen Jezebel set out to kill him.

Discouraged and depressed, Elijah escapes to the Sinai desert. No one is faithful to God any more, and he wants to die. God sets him down and shows him powerful signs.

But God is not in these powerful displays. Finally, in a gentle breeze, Elijah encounters God. The message: Don't look for spectacles; you will find God in the peace of your soul; from there he will triumph over all difficulties.

The background of the Gospel is actually the setting of the Church of around 80 A.D. Christians had been expelled from the Synagogue. They were now outlaws to the Romans. They were persecuted and killed.

The Church is seen as a boat being tossed about in a storm. Jesus comes walking on the water. The disciples can't believe it is he. As a test, Peter is invited to walk on the water. He loses faith and begins to sink.

Jesus saves him and says that if he had faith he could do what Jesus did. Jesus gets into the boat and calms the storm. The lesson: the Church can weather any storm if we only have faith.

In the second reading, Paul is in agony because his fellow Jews do not accept Jesus. He, too, must learn to trust and to have faith that God's will will be accomplished.

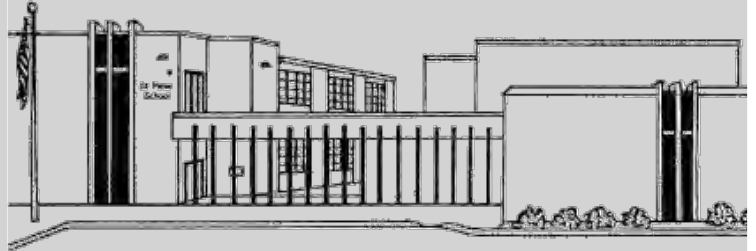

May God's most Holy Spirit continue to lead and guide us!

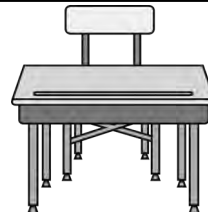

As the clergy, religious, and faithful mourn their shepherd, they continue to bear the responsibility of serving some of the poorest and most vulnerable communities in rural areas of the Diocese. The Diocese is a lifeline for widows, orphans, the elderly, the homeless, and the socially displaced people who, in a functioning society, should be cared for by established government institutions. Violence, insecurity, and economic hardship have left many families shattered.
