Sirach 27:30–28:7; Romans 14:7-9;

Matthew 18: 21-35

The Gospel selection is taken from “the Sermon on the Church.” How many times should you forgive an offense? In the time of Jesus, the Scribes argued about this. Most of them said that we might forgive a person three times; they said that only God could forgive four times and that was the most.

Peter, then, thinks that he is being big-hearted when he asks Jesus if they should forgive “seven” times. Jesus replies, “Not seven times; but seventy times seven times!” This was unheard of. But it gives us one of the basic roots of our faith; it tells us how our faith is different from all other religions of the world.

Our faith is based on forgiveness. God is infinitely merciful. He forgives the unforgivable. He constantly calls sinners to repentance. He reaches out to those who do not deserve forgiveness. *And he expects us to do the same!* No other religion in the world has such a belief in the merciful forgiveness of God.

The “huge amount” which is forgiven in the Gospel is actually a specific figure: “10,000 talents.” A talent was a measure of silver or gold; 10,000 talents would be worth about \$18,000,000.00! The “mere fraction” was also a specific figure: “100 Denarii.” This would be worth about \$15.00! The lesson, of course, is that God has forgiven us infinitely, and he expects us to be forgiving of others.

The first reading tells us that we must not hang on to our anger or it will consume us. We cannot be unforgiving of others and expect God to forgive us. A paraphrase of this is in this Lord’s Prayer, where we pray that we shall be forgiven only if God forgives us.

The second reading tells us that we are not our own. We belong to the Lord and are responsible to him. Let us reflect his forgiveness in our lives.

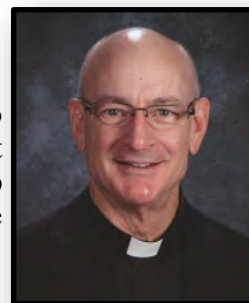

And in that trust in God and in that Unity of the many we found our strength and determination to stand together under our GOD's benevolent Hands.

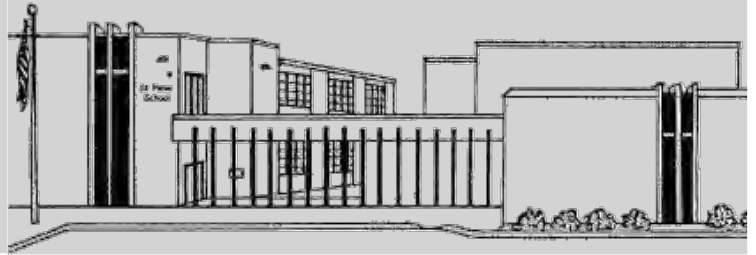

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Sahel region separates the Sahara Desert of north Africa from the humid regions to the south. It stretches west to east across Africa, from Mauritania on the Atlantic Ocean to Sudan on the Red Sea. Desertification, shortage of resources, and armed conflicts between governments and Islamist affiliates of al-Qaida and the Islamic State group – these and other factors have affected millions throughout the region, particularly in the west African country of Mali.

Malian young people— especially those personally exposed to the violence of war and the anxiety of political and personal insecurity — urgently need to experience Christ's love as found in the Bible and in the Catholic Church's teachings on human dignity so that they can grow into future leaders working toward peace. With support received from the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa, the Episcopal Conference of Mali brought together young people for such an encounter. The conference gathered nearly 200 young Catholic men and women, ages 18 to 35, from across Mali's five dioceses to attend a special Bible camp. There, the young participants learned about the Catholic principles of religious freedom, interreligious dialogue, and peace found in Scripture and in the Second Vatican Council's teachings.

Your support for the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa helps young people encounter the teachings of the Church and grow as disciples who are eager to share Christ's peace where so many have experienced conflict and war.
