Ask Father...

Q: What is the Church's teaching on the
"Three Days of Darkness"?

A: The "Three Days of Darkness" (the concept that a judgment will come upon the earth, and the earth will be preternaturally shrouded in darkness) falls under the category of "private" revelations, some of which have been recognized by the authority of the Church. They do not belong, however, to the deposit of faith [that which is contained in Sacred Scripture and Tradition]. It is not their role to improve or complete Christ's definitive Revelation, but to help live more fully by it in a certain period of history. Guided by the magisterium [official teaching authority] of the Church, the *senus fidelium* ("sense of the faithful") knows how to discern and welcome in these revelations whatever constitutes an authentic call of Christ or his saints to the Church. (CCC, no. 67)

Presently, the Catholic Church has no official teaching, doctrine, or formal stance regarding the future "Three Days of Darkness". No ecclesiastical investigation has been conducted to give validity to this revelation and consequently no one is obligated to adhere to its predictions.

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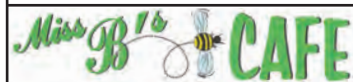
