Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Ezekiel 33:7-9; Romans 13:8-10;
 Matthew 18:15-20

Today and next Sunday, our Gospel selection is taken from the third of Jesus' five great sermons in Matthew, from the Sermon on the Church. This sermon tells of the relationships which should characterize members of the Church.

Today, the Lord tells us that we must be humble enough to offer fraternal correction privately. It is easy to gossip about another person's faults. But Christians are called to do something about them.

We must recognize our own frailty and failures, while at the same time pointing out another person's faults *privately*. If this does not work, then we take another person with us, but still we keep it private. If this fails, we submit the problem to the community of faith.

The reading concludes with the spiritual power of the community: Whatever it binds is bound. Whenever the community unites in prayer, the Lord will grant it. Wherever two or three are gathered in his name, he is with them.

The other two readings complement the Gospel. We are called to share in the prophetic ministry: this means that we must not keep silence, but must *prudently* warn others of sin. All this must be done in charity.

The second reading tells us that our only debt to each other must be the debt of loving. We must love our neighbor as ourselves.

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23RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In the first reading, God appoints Ezekiel as a “watchman” for the people. A watchman has the responsibility to see what others may not see and, when danger is approaching, to sound the alarm. This is not a responsibility born of judgment or condemnation, but of love. Ezekiel is reminded that he cannot simply remain silent when someone is heading in the wrong direction. There are times in our own lives when we too must be willing to speak a difficult word to a friend, a family member, or a fellow Catholic. That can be uncomfortable. We may be afraid of offending someone or damaging a relationship. Yet genuine love sometimes requires us to have the courage to speak the truth. The important question is not whether we correct someone, but **how** we do it - with humility, charity, patience, and a sincere desire for that person’s good. To save their soul.

In the Gospel, Jesus gives us a very practical way of dealing with conflict and sin within the Christian community. This is called Fraternal Correction. He tells us first to speak privately with the person who has offended us. We are not to begin by gossiping, complaining to everyone else, or seeking to embarrass the other person. We begin with a conversation marked by respect and love.

Jesus then reminds us of the power of Christian community and prayer: “Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.” As members of the Church, we are responsible for one another. We are called not to tear one another down, but to help one another return to the Lord. That does include excommunication, which is not a casting out forever, but a last-ditch hope of showing the gravity of the action until it changes. This is especially important in our families, our parish, and our community. May we have the courage to speak when we need to speak, the humility to listen when we need to listen, and above all, the charity to remember that Christ is present whenever we sincerely gather in his name seeking reconciliation and peace.

We have had a lot of new and young faces here. Whether they are visiting, or from QND or QU, let’s make sure we welcome everyone as Christ to our community. Go talk to them and welcome them. Make sure we are willing to move seats or shift over to welcome people. Make sure we speak to them and tell them how excited we are that they are here. Help them connect and want to return!
